#### Contract Bridge

#### AFTER A TAKEOUT DOUBLE

Almost every player of even reasonable skill knows when his hand calls for a takeout double of an opponent's bid. However, what the doubler should do subsequently is not so well understood. Observe this case:

West dealer.  
North-South vulnerable.

♠ A Q 10 6	♥ K J 9 5
♦ J 10 7 5	♣ 6 3
♠ K 8 6	♥ 10 7 5
♦ A K	♣ A Q 10 4

The bidding:

West	North	East	South
1♣	1♦	1♠	Pass
Pass	2♦	Pass	2♥
Pass	3♥	Pass	4♥
Dble.	Pass	Pass	Pass

There was very little to the play. West opened his singleton spade, and South had to lose two spade tricks, two trumps and the ace of diamonds, for a 500-point penalty. It is true that South was rather optimistic when he accepted North's urge to bid game, but the major share of responsibility rested on North. It was North who, by figuratively "begging" his partner to go on, really took the set. South, a nationally-famous expert, realized that he was pushing a little, but he reasoned that his hand, though certainly not strong, was nevertheless better than North had the right to expect, and so South bid the game rather than hang one trick short.

The probability is that North himself did not realize how aggressively he bid his hand! His first double was strong; his second double, in the face of South's refusal to come in over one spade, was far stronger; and North's final bid—his raise to three hearts—was the announcement of a powerhouse! Unquestionably North had a good hand, but it was not that good! Under the vulnerable conditions, South would have strained a point to bid over one spade, and since he did not do so, North, having doubled for the second time, should have been quite satisfied to rest at two hearts.
