

Local and Other Items.

The Island Revenue collections of April amounted to \$40,523. Our correspondent "Boiler" got to enclose his card in confidence. The best stock of Pruits in the city at the London House. Mr. H. McKay has been appointed Harbor Master of Murray Harbor. PARASOLS and Umbrellas, a large stock, very cheap, at the London House. Mr. CHARLES H. LUGGIN has withdrawn from the editorial chair of the St. John's Telegraph. The Great Slaughter of dry goods, oil paintings, chromos, photo frames, mirrors, etc., positively closes this Monday evening. A CAMP has been authorized for Prince Edward Island. It will be held at Hunter River, commencing the 1st of July, and will be commanded by Col. Taylor, D. A. G. FROM January 1st to May 30th the United Pacific Railroad sold 1,439,000 acres of land for \$3,542,000. This land has been considerably barren. It was mostly purchased by cattle ranchers. TWO MEN DROWNED.—On Thursday about one o'clock, two French seamen of the bark Leopold et Marie, lying at anchor off Black Brook Mill, Miramichi, were drowned alongside their vessel. THERE was a family of McDonalds at Vandy's brook, Gulf Shore, Pictou, (known as the McLachlans) with six brothers, the eldest of whom died aged 105 years, and the youngest 23.—Pictou News. MR. J. D. HENDERSON, representative of the Agricultural Implement Manufacturing Co., of Moncton, is at the Revere. He is about establishing agencies of the Company in this Province. MONCTON SHIPMENTS.—On Wednesday the sugar refinery exported ninety barrels and yesterday 170 barrels of sugar. The cotton mill yesterday shipped eleven bales of it a gooner.—Transcript, May 30th. THE Black Diamond steamer Coban, Capt. R. Fraser, made a quick passage to St. John's, Nfld. She left this port at 10 o'clock on Thursday morning, left Pictou at 9:30 on Friday morning, and reached St. John's all well yesterday. MR. JAMES MCKENNA, Travelling Passenger Agent of the Canadian Pacific Railway, is at the Revere. He comes to show the people of P. E. I. that the C. P. Railway is the shortest, quickest and cheapest route to the Golden North West. AN order in Council respecting herring fisheries provides that no sooner are to be thrown or nets set within 600 feet of spawning grounds between the 20th June and the 15th August, or within 600 feet of a weir or license at any time. ASHER BLACK of Amherst, N. S., committed suicide this morning by hanging himself in the barn. The act is supposed to have been done in a fit of temporary insanity. The deceased was very much respected and the family have been very lately bereaved of the father. THE prevailing east wind has driven large quantities of ice into Georgetown, Souris and Cardigan harbors. In Souris harbor the ice is loose, and three schooners worked through it into the harbor this forenoon. The ice in Georgetown and Cardigan harbors is also loose. AN order in Council is published regulating the fisheries on the Westigoche and its tributaries. Fly surface fishing is to be in season from 1st May to 15th August. The use of trawl position of salmon nets from the middle grounds below Campbell's is to be settled by the local inspector. The use of none is allowed above tidal water. At the Stipendiary Magistrate's Court, this forenoon, the Scott Act case of John Bolger, Railway House, Water Street, was adjourned until to-morrow; and the case of H. B. Smith was postponed a week. One drunk was disposed of. John Shea was fined \$20 or two months imprisonment for assaulting Abraham White. UNION DAY AMONGST THE METHODISTS.—Sabbath, June 1st, being the day when the Methodist Churches of this Dominion were legally made one, appropriate services were held in the afternoon, at Union Road. Rev. J. M. Tredrea preached. Afterwards a Love Feast was held, when the Rev. G. Steel presided. Both services were very profitable. AN old woman named Gordon in the north of Scotland was listening to the account given in Scripture of Solomon's glory, which was read to her by a little female grandchild. When the little girl came to tell of the thousands of camels which formed part of the Jewish sovereign's live stock, "What," cried the old woman, "a thousand Camels'—is, say? The Camels are an odd clan, sure enough, but look at 'ye dinnae see the Gordons, too." THE Pugwash correspondent of the Sackville Post says:—"Mr. Elliott's schooner Advance, chartered to carry produce from P. E. Island to Newfoundland, has, during the last three weeks, made several unsuccessful attempts to get to the Island, and was driven into the harbor on Sunday morning by ice. Schooner Zeland, lumber laden, for Charlottetown, after waiting two or three weeks for a chance, started on Saturday evening, but had to run on Sunday morning." THE Digby Courier says:—"A heavy storm of thunder and lightning passed over on Saturday evening, extending its greatest force about Brighton and its vicinity. A house belonging to Mr. Charles VanBlarcom, which had just been completed, was struck by the lightning and burned to the ground. It was fortunately unoccupied. Fences were destroyed, two barns struck, and some sheep were killed. It is very rarely that a similar storm of such severity visits this part of the country."

RECEPTION OF MEMBERS.—On May 17th and 18th reception services were held at Brackley Point Road and St. Stanhope on the Little York Circuit, by the Rev. G. Steel. THE Bennett-Mackay cable will make things pleasant for the newspapers. Already there are threats of cutting rates down far beyond anything ever known before. DR. DONALD MACLEOD, a Scotch clergyman, recently preached a sermon on "The sin of cheapness." He said that the "craving for cheapness and hunting after bargains is not only economically false, but a cause of great suffering to thousands of men, women and children." THE grog shops of the city of Mexico have such titles as, "The birth of Venus," "The kiss of love," "The life eternal," "The Bacchus," "The shipwreck," "The delirium tremens," and "The little hell." Mexican toppers are determined to know the name of the road to ruin on which they are travelling. GEORGE, eldest son of George W. Baillie, publisher of the Pictou Standard, aged four years, was accidentally drowned on the 28th ult. The child was missed about half-past five, and search was made for him in the neighborhood. He was discovered about six o'clock in a barrel that had been sunk for a well. THE will of Charles O'Connor, the late jurist, bequeaths to the New York Law Institute \$70,000 and all the bound volumes of his own works; also several silver testimonials; \$30,000 in private bequests to relatives and friends, and two-thirds of the residue to his sister Eliza M. Sloan, and the remaining third to Julia Pardon Mullaney. THE death is announced of Alexander McKay, of Truro. He was well known to a very large number of the travelling public, having been for many years proprietor of the Prince of Wales hotel at Truro. Previous to that he was proprietor of the Caledonia and Acadian hotels, Halifax. In 1875 he was appointed inspector of weights and measures for Colchester and Pictou counties. PERSONAL.—Rev. G. Steele, who is completing his term on the Little York Circuit received at a full Quarterly Meeting, recently held, a very hearty and unanimous vote of thanks for his labors. Reference was made to the financial and spiritual success of the Circuit during the past three years, and sorrow was expressed because the law of the Church would not allow him to remain longer.
