Vic Seixas Wins World Amateur Tennis Title

 WIMBLEDON, (AP) — Big Vic Seixas of Philadelphia, playing flawless tennis, ran through Kurt Nielsen of Denmark in the finals of the Wimbledon men's championship Friday to take the coveted world amateur title back to the United States.

Seixas sealed off set scores of 9-7, 6-3, 6-4, in one hour and 19 minutes. There was never much doubt that he would win once he started to give the Dane some of his own medicine.

Americans won Wimbledon championships from 1947 through 1951, Australia's Frank Sedgman, now a pro, took the crown last year.

Saturday the ladies' championship final will be between Maureen Connolly of San Diego, Calif., and Doris Hart of Coral Gables, Fla. The weather was not good for tennis, it was almost cold and there was a penetrating dampness. But hundreds had queued outside all night to snap up the few general public tickets to be sold.
