



Prospective Strawberry Growers Meet

ALBERTON — Reid Sangster, director of research and marketing, Parker Jewell of York and Rudy Dallanback, Prince County fieldman for ARDA, addressed a meeting of prospective strawberry growers in Alberton yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Jewell, who operates a nursery, gave expert advice on the growing and cultivating of strawberries while Mr. Sangster dealt mainly with marketing problems. Both speakers gave encouraging advice to the 30 people present for future prospects in the berry industry. Long range prospects indicate an almost unlimited market, Mr. Sangster said.

Farmers who have not previously grown strawberries should start with about one quarter acre and work up, Mr. Jewell advised. An expanded output from a large acreage in West Prince would eventually call for freezing facilities.

Rev. Gerald Steele also spoke briefly.

The meeting was opened by Walter Christopher of Tignish.

S'side Boys' Club Soon Operating

SUMMERSIDE — Under the supervision of Borden Broyles, Croftman MacArthur and Melville Campbell, the new Summerside Boys Club will soon be in operation on the corner of Notre Dame and Cedar Streets.

The establishment has three floors, first consisting of a hobby room which will deal with woodcraft, model building, such as airplanes, ships, trains, cars, etc.; the repairing of bicycles for club members, leathercraft, and other wood work hobbies. Also a weight lifting room where weight lifting equipment will be used; a locker room in which it is hoped every boy will eventually have his own locker; a boys wash room consisting of showers, wash basins and toilets; staff and ladies' wash rooms will consist of wash basins, toilets and various lockers for general storage, and a furnace room.

The second floor will consist of the main office and registration room in which a record file on every member will be kept; large sports room including ping pong, floor hockey, and various competitive team sports will be played; a games room in which the younger boys' activities will take place such as, checkers, dominoes, hockey sets and other small games; a coat and overshoe room with lockers being placed near the entrance.

The third floor consists of a television sitting room which will be open certain hours under supervision; a canteen and kitchen combined to provide confectionaries and eventually have the necessary supplies to have boys' banquets and provide fund raising projects; a cloak and storage room; a library (developed) and a study room where the boys may do their homework or read books and a meeting room for stamp, coin and other group collective hobbies.

ITEMS NEEDED

Senior Citizen Monthly Rent Remains \$50

The \$50 a month rent for single units in government-operated housing for the Island's senior citizens will be maintained according to Henry Wedge, minister of welfare and labor.

Last week it was announced in Ottawa that Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation had approved a \$686,741 loan toward the province's program of providing senior citizens' housing. The Ottawa report indicated that monthly rentals for the units would be about \$63.

BASED ON TOTAL

Mr. Wedge said today that the \$63 figure was based on total capital costs and did not take into consideration other forms of assistance for the housing program.

"With funds we get through the winter works program and the grants the province gets toward this type of housing, we are able to hold our monthly rentals at \$50 per unit," the minister said.

Mr. Wedge added that the 600 units have been in operation more than a year and a year's operation showed that rentals in the \$50 per month bracket make the operation of the units practical.

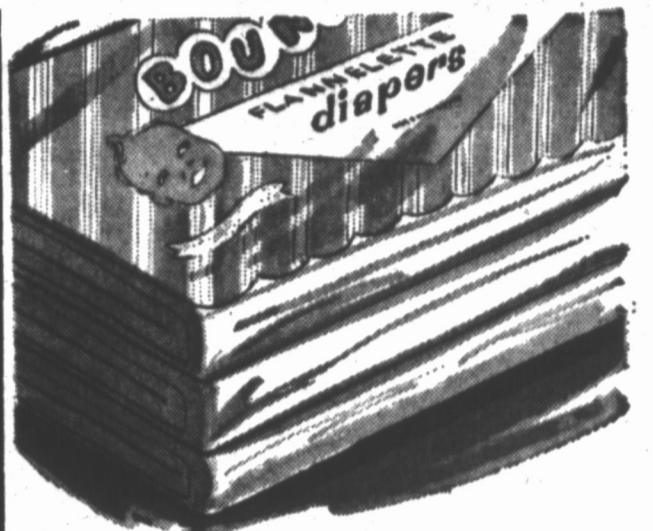
