Parking Meters In Operation This Morning

Effective 8:00 o'clock this morning, the parking meters installed on the streets of Charlottetown will be put into operation and cars—including small trucks parked there will comply with the instructions on the side of the meter, or suffer the consequences of a violation of the City by-law respecting meters. All meters are installed where angle parking is allowed.

The city by-law prohibits the angle parking of vehicles of a greater overall length than ordinary private passenger vehicle; therefore it will be illegal for large trucks to be in the metered area; i. e. parked in the angle parking zones.

The operation of the parking meter is indeed simple. Car drivers are instructed to park their cars

so that the bumper is close to the side of the meter. An arrow on the twin meter indicates which side the driver is to use. Directly above the time indicator or red flag is a slot for pennies or a nickel. When a penny is dropped in the slot the flag drops down indicating 12 minute parking time; if two pen-

nies are put in the flag drops automatically to 24 minute parking time and so on up to 60 minutes. If the driver decides he is going to park for an hour, a five cent piece (nickel) may be put in the slot and the flag will automatically drop to the 60 minute mark.

All meters are installed where angle parking is allowed. The city by law prohibits the angle parking of vehicles of a greater overall length than an ordinary private passenger vehicle; therefore it will be illegal for large trucks to be in the metered area; i.e. parked in the angle parking zones.
