

# Rain Sewage Disposal In Harbor's Protested

A public meeting composed of residents of Kirkwood Drive and surrounding area and interested parties concerned with water contamination in Charlottetown Harbor went on record last night as urging the "City of Charlottetown, Parkdale, Sherwood, and the provincial government to discontinue the dumping of raw sewage in Charlottetown Harbor."

Copies of the recommendation will be sent to all bodies named. Meeting for the second time within a week, reports were given on meetings with the provincial government officials, a group of Mayor A. Walthen Gaudet.

Jack Johnston, chairman of the committee, said the provincial government officials advised that before the next swimming season a lagoon would be built at Riverside Hospital and a septic tank at Beach Grove. The meeting with Mayor Gaudet resulted in the understanding that daily tests of the water at Kirkwood Drive would be made.

TESTS TO BE MADE  
Mrs. Gordon Hughes said that tests will be made today and Saturday and the report will be made Monday. She said if the report was favorable the swimming classes would be continued in the area Tuesday morning.

## Tests Show One Park Area Now In Pollution

In general the area in the immediate neighborhood of the bathing house at Victoria Park is safe for swimming, it would appear from results of testing for pollution carried out by the provincial department of health for city authorities. All other sections of city beaches, however, have signs prohibiting swimming.

In the tests made this month by the department samples of the water at the bathing house were taken on 16 occasions under different tide and wind conditions.

Of these eight samples showed a coliform count of 50 or less which is considered good. When the count ranges from 50 to 100 it is considered doubtful and the other eight samples taken during the testing period were in this classification. None of the samples showed a count higher than 500.

A report of the testing was received by Mayor A. Walthen Gaudet and released with permission of the department as the tests were made at the request of the city. The Mayor stated he felt the public should be informed of the condition.

The tests were made by the department, through its sanitary engineering division, when the tide was rising, full and falling. Samples were also taken during gentle and moderate onshore or offshore winds.
