RHODES SCHOLARSHIPS

Eleven Rhodes scholarships are now open for Canadian students and will be awarded late in November. Applications must be in by October 25, 1980.

These scholarships are tenable at the University of Oxford, England, and the value is 36,000 (pounds) per year. They are granted for two years with the possibility of a third year. Scholars may follow courses of their own choice. They are required to go to Oxford in October 1981.

NATURAL SCIENCES AND ENGINEERING RESEARCH COUNCIL POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

The value of this award is \$6,360 plus travel. It is one year renewable. Candidates must be registered in or eligible for admission to a graduate school of a Canadian University as fully qualified candidates in a program of studies and research leading to an advanced degree. Tenable in Canada but in exceptional circumstances elsewhere.
