

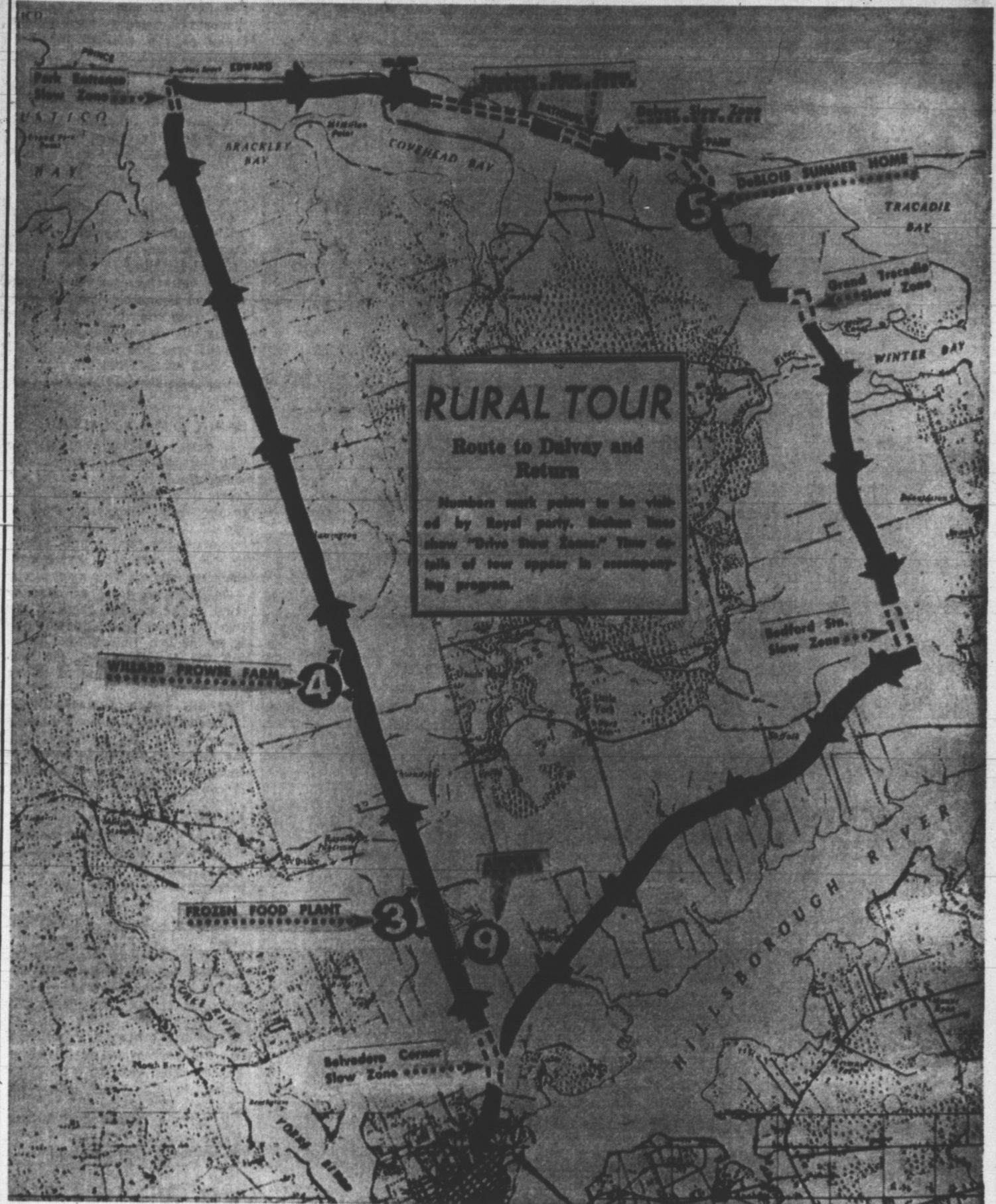
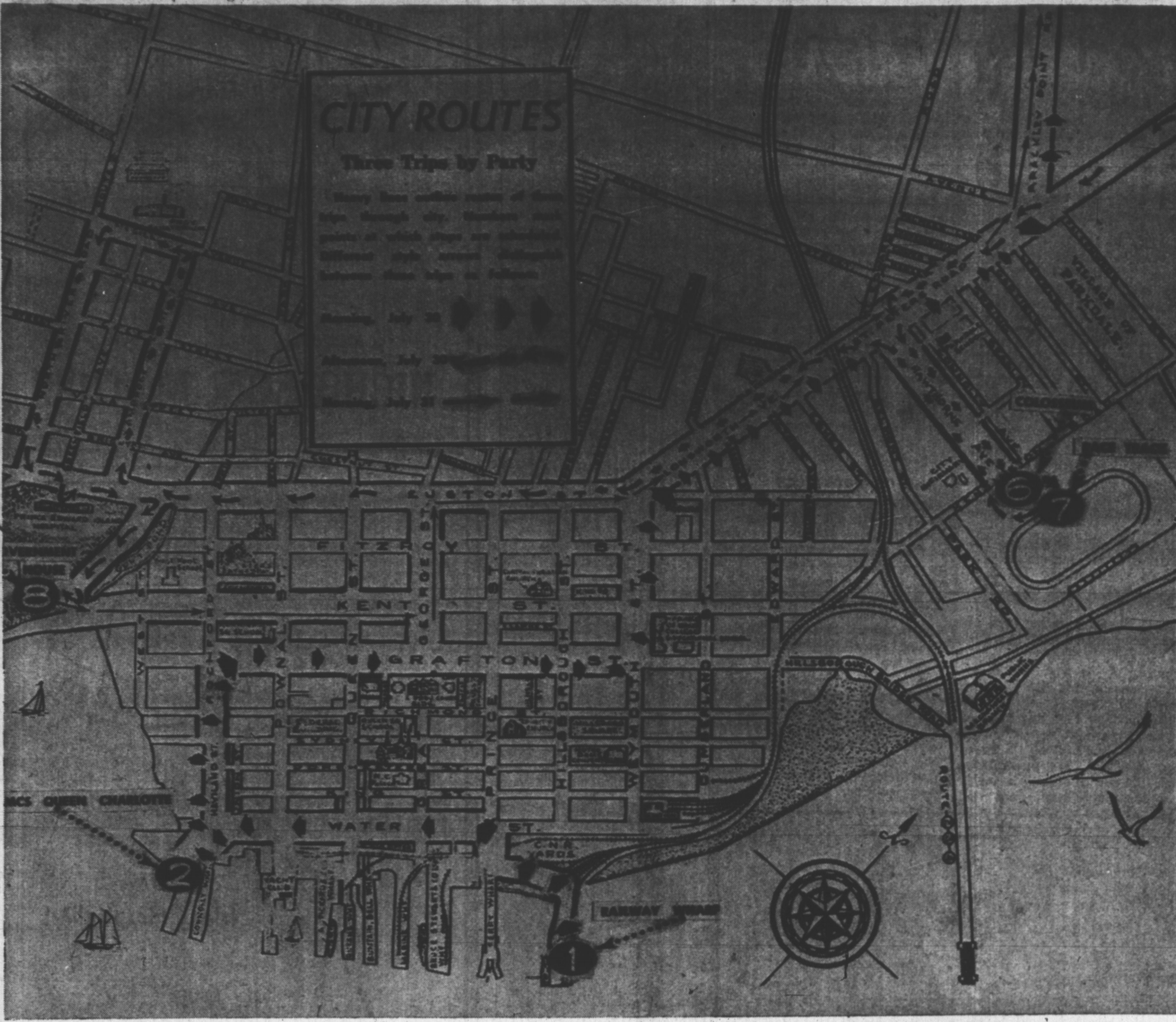

**Here's Quick Outline Of Visit Program**

The detailed program for the Island visit of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and His Royal Highness Prince Philip appears on page 12 of this section. But a quick outline of where they'll go, what they'll do, who they'll see and the best opportunities of seeing the Royal couple is provided by the two accompanying maps.

Numbers on the two maps, from one to nine, indicate the progress from point to point of the entire Island visit, while "Slow Drive Zones", where those gathered will have a good chance to see the Queen and Prince are shown with broken lines on the Rural Tour map above.

The plan for the tour, as indicated by key figures on the maps, is as follows:

**THURSDAY JULY 30**

- 1 - Royal arrival scheduled for 10 a.m. at Railway Wharf, where there will be brief official welcome extending until 10:10 a.m. Party then proceeds via Prince and Water Streets.
- 2 - Her Majesty is due at HMCS Queen Charlotte at 10:15 a.m., where she will meet service, and provincial and civic figures, etc., before

departing at 10:35 a.m. via Rochford, Grafton, Weymouth Streets, Longworth Avenue, St. Peters Road, Brackley Point Road and Sherwood Road.

- 3 - Party is due at 11 a.m. at plant of Prince Edward Island Frosted Foods Ltd., and to proceed at 11:25 a.m. via Brackley Point Road.
- 4 - Arrival at farm of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Prowse set for 11:35 a.m., with stay continuing until noon, when party proceeds by way of Brackley Beach, Stanhope Camp, etc.
- 5 - Royal party to be entertained at 1 p.m. luncheon at DeBlois summer home, with His Honor Lt.-Gov. F. W. Hyndman as host, and departure due at 2 p.m. via Bedford, St. Peters Road and Hawthorne Avenue.
- 6 - Party due at Colosseum at 2:40 p.m. for events centred about children and youth leaders, with demonstration continuing until 2:50 p.m.
- 7 - Her Majesty is scheduled to reach race track 2:50 p.m. and to stay until 3:35 p.m. before proceeding to Government House by way of Haw-

thorne Avenue, St. Peters Road, Longworth Avenue, Euston Street, Ambrose Street, McGill Avenue, North River Road, Brighton Road, Hospital Driveway and Government Pond Roadway.

- 8 - Her Majesty is due to arrive at 4 p.m. at Government House, where she will be present at an afternoon tea on the lawn, a private dinner and spend the night.
  - 9 - The Royal party is scheduled to leave Charlottetown Airport at 9:30 a.m., following a brief ceremony at the airport at 9:25 a.m. Her Majesty is due to leave Government House at 9 a.m. and go to the airport by way of Kent, Great George and Euston Streets, Longworth Avenue, St. Peters Road and Brackley Point Road.
- Exact location of "Slow Drive Zones" as indicated on Rural Tour map above, is as follows: Belvedere Corner; Brackley entrance to National Park; junction Bay Shore Road Stanhope to Stanhope Camp Grounds; Stanhope Lane picnic grounds; Dalvay swimming station to DeBlois summer home; Grand Tracadie settlement and Bedford Station.



THE TOP ROLE in perfecting Island plans for this week's Royal visit has been played by members of this group, the Provincial Advisory Committee which has been functioning since early this year.
