SUMMERSIDE — Every year one of the features of the Lobster Carnival festivities here are the vaudeville acts in Civic Stadium which provide entertainment for young and old. This year is no exception.

The manager of the stadium and one of the Lobster Carnival officers, Charles Hogan, has arranged for three top acts which will remain here throughout the week and put on three shows

OBTAIN ENTERTAINERS

This again will be a two-hour program in the stadium and a committee spokesman stated recently that already some 25 entertainers have been contacted to perform for the audience.

The program will be highlighted by Irish dancing, jigs, dancing etc.

Mrs. Leslie Ramsay, Indian River, will present an Irish monologue while "The Townfolk" a local trio, along with a number of other entertainers will provide the musical entertainment.

Among the performers are Paul Smith, Nunkwa; stepdancer; Arlene Gaudet, Summerside, singer; George MacDonald, Charlottetown, tenor; Helen Bradley, Charlottetown, folksinger; as well as Mrs. Mary Kelly, Charlottetown step-dancing teacher, and two of her students, plus many others.

It has also been learned that the Benevolent Irish Society of Charlottetown will provide some acts for the program.

Track, field meet has big schedule

SUMMERSIDE — On the second day of Lobster Carnival Week, Tuesday, July 11, a provincial AAU of C. Open Track and field meet will be held at the Sports Complex on Grandville Street north with entries from all over the Maritimes and especially, Antigonish, St. John's, Halifax and Oromocto, N.B. as well as Island athletes expected to participate.

The meet, sponsored by the Lobster Carnival and the provincial division of physical education and alcoholic studies, has an expected total of 24 events getting underway at 10 a.m. and continuing throughout the day until completion.

There are five classes for men and four classes for women and a total of 150 entries are anticipated.

A feature event on the program will be the tri-provincial relay where a team of the best four runners from each province will be competing against each other.

The men's classes are: Open, Junior, Juvenile, Midget and Bantam. There are 14 events in the Men's Open, 11 in the Junior, 14 in the Juvenile, 12 in the Midget class and four in the Bantam. The women's classes are Open, Juvenile, Midget and Bantam. The open consists of 10 events, the Juvenile, six events, Midget eight and Bantam two.

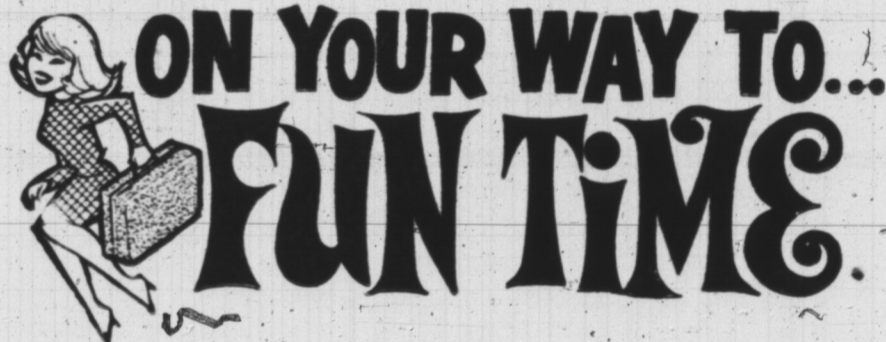
