As the upward drive—which has carried averages to historic heights in the previous three days—ran out of gas, the pace of trading slowed.

Volume sank to 5,870,000 shares from 6,560,000 Wednesday.

The Dow Jones average ended with a decline of .95 at 911.91.

The most active stock was Colorado Fuel and Iron, which rose 1/4 to 15 1/4 on 116,200 shares.

General Motors opened at its peak of 108 1/2 but ended with a net loss of 1/2.

Canadian Pacific dropped 1 1/2 points among Canadians. Dome Mines was down 1/2.

Prices were generally higher on the American Stock Exchange. Canadian Javelin advanced 1/2.

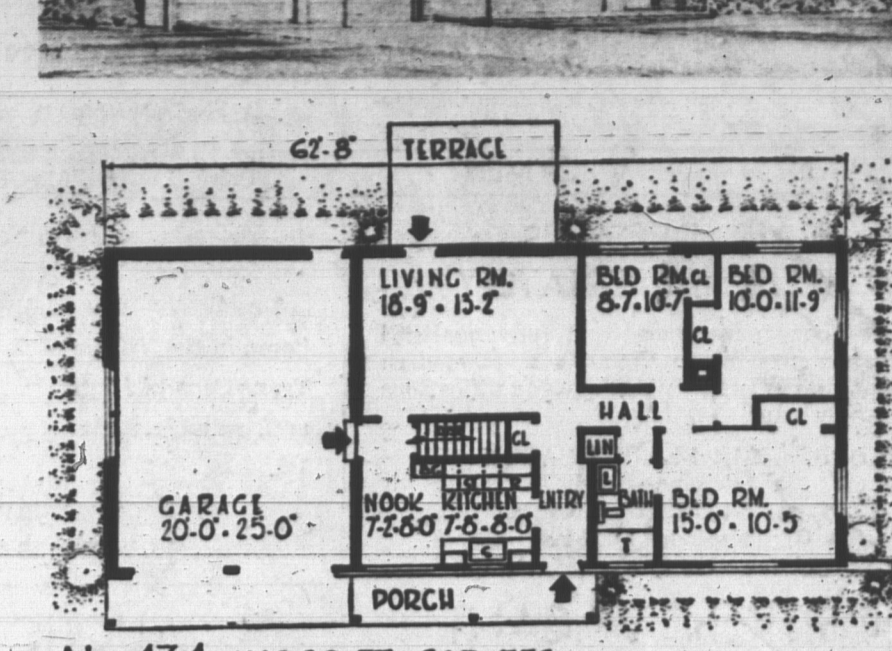
