QUEBEC, (CP)—Henri Kieffer, head of provincial forest protection service, said Monday a forest fire is burning out of control at Riviere Saul au Cochon, about 200 miles northeast of Quebec and 65 miles north of Forestville.

More than 400 men were reported battling the blaze, which has burned over an estimated three square miles.

Route from Seoul northward claimed lives of many during the bitter arctic-like winter of 1950-51, according to the returnees.
