Air Launched Cruise Missile Test Undertaken

EDMONTON - A captive carry test of the unarmed air launched cruise missile was conducted in northwestern Canada by the United States Air Force on Saturday, March 24, 1990.

During the captive carry mission, the AGM-129A cruise missile remained attached to an American B-52 aircraft, which took-off and returned to its United States base without landing in Canada.

The aircraft flew over the Beaufort Sea, followed the

MacKenzie River valley and then turned eastward near the junction of the borders of the Northwest Territories, Alberta, and British Columbia. The aircraft then continued southward to the Primrose Lake Evaluation Range near Canadian Forces Base Cold Lake, Alta., before it returned to the United States.

A Notice to Airmen (NOTAM) was issued by Transport Canada 48 hours in advance to notify the aviation community of

the test.

Cruise missile testing in Canada is carried out under the Canada-United States Test and Evaluation Agreement signed in February 1983 and renewed in 1988.

Participation in the testing is an acceptance of Canada's obligations and responsibilities with the NATO alliance. This participation contributes to maintaining a balance of forces which effectively contributes to global stability.
