A modern passenger train rolling along at 70 to 80 miles an hour is a 1500-ton projectile of tremendous momentum and velocity. Trains of such weight and speed cannot be stopped within the short distance necessary to avoid collision with a motorist who may have decided to indulge in one of the many hazardous practices which brought death to 140 and injuries to 540 others in 443 railway crossing accidents reported to the Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada during the 12-month period ended June 30th.
