WHIEREAS the General Assembly of this Island stands prorogued until Tuesday, the Twenty-fifth day of June next. I have thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued until THURSDAY, the First day of AUGUST next, of which all persons concerned are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

		60 Seconds.

In consequence of the arrangements to be made for substituting the new apparatus to the old one, and necessary repairs to the Light House, the present Light will cease to be shewn from the night of TUESDAY, the Ninth day of JULY, 1867, until the night of THURSDAY, the First day of AUGUST, 1867, being the time fixed for putting the new light in operation.
