MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S. dollar Tuesday closed at a discount of 3 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, up 1.16. Pound sterling \$2.67 1/2, up 3.16.

TORONTO STOCKS

TORONTO (CP)—A light flurry of selling in closing minutes Tuesday pushed the stock market a shade lower. Base metals, particularly seniors, led the decline with a one-point loss on their index.
Western oils lost quarter of a point on their index while golds, mainly because of a 1/4-point climb by McIntyre, gained almost one-half point.
Rowkin, for the third straight session, again recorded a strong gain, up 17 cents to \$1.23. Uranium was higher in a 20-cent range while base metals were mixed to lower.
Canada Southern Pet featured western oils, climbing 85 cents to \$7.60.
Index changes: Golds up .45 to 79.28; base metals off .99 to 211.79; western oils off .25 to 172.47.

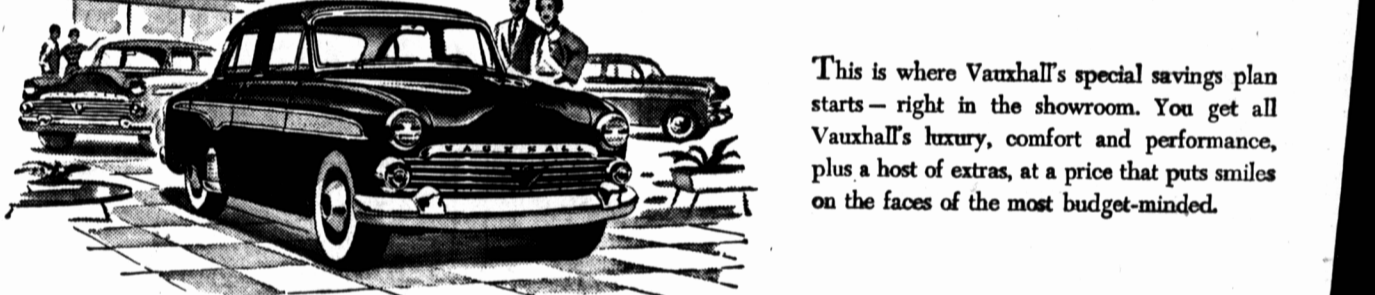
Report Is Given Of Leadership Course

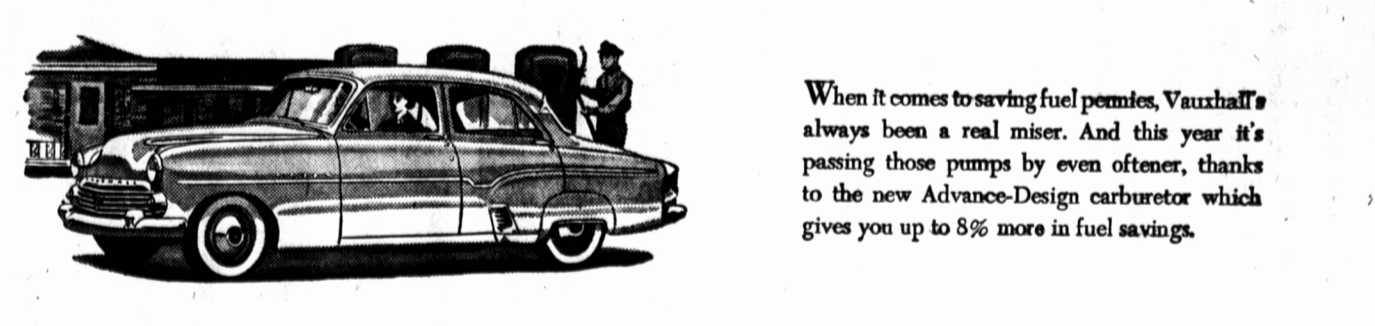

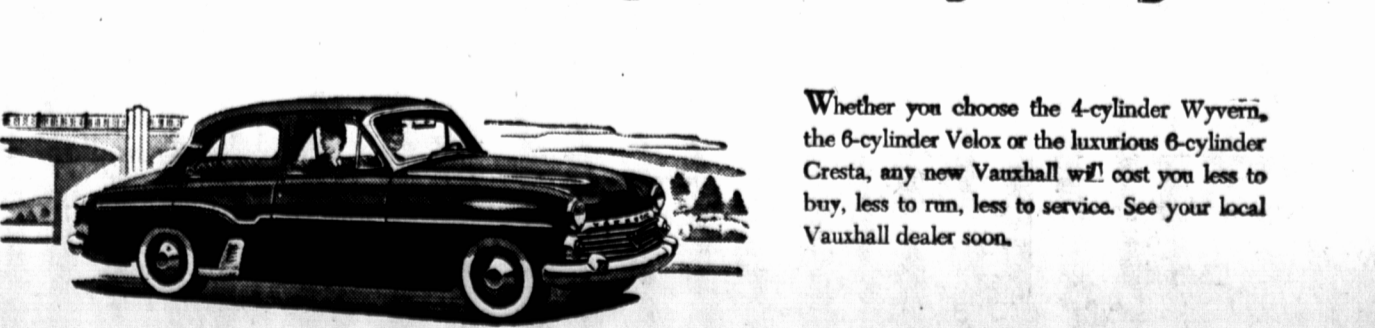
ALBERTA PERMITS OUT
