The Hon. B. Earle MacDonald announced yesterday that the Provincial Government has loaned the Lowe property on Kent Street, between Cumberland and Edward Streets, to the Charlottetown Playground Commission.

Mr. MacDonald further stated that because of the contribution of recreation to health and good citizenship, he felt the citizens in the East end of our City should have adequate facilities.

Mr. J. Russell St. John, chairman of the Charlottetown Playground Commission, stated that the Commission was extremely pleased with the Government's action. Mr. St. John also stated that work on this new project would begin at once.

The chairman said that the Charlottetown Playground Commission promotes a program, the purpose of which is that every child in Charlottetown may have a fair chance to play. However, he said that new equipment would have to be purchased to provide for the new playground. It is hoped that the City, or some interested organization, will supply the necessary equipment for this project.
