Ford Head Sees Price Rise Halt

TORONTO (CP) — A halt in price rises was foreseen Thursday by Rhus M. Sale, president of Ford Motor Company of Canada, in his address to the company's annual meeting.

He could see no reason, he said, for "panic propaganda" from any quarter about so-called "creeping inflation."

By and large there is no inflationary tendency in the consumer-goods field, and much less inflationary pressure than a year ago in the capital goods area.

There had been price increases, but price indices in Canada in recent years had shown remarkable stability and economists believed the higher levels of the last few months would show a downward adjustment this year.

In most inflation discussions, too little was said of "the tremendous inflationary force" of taxation, which had more to do with high prices than most people suspected.

Business will be at least as good this year as last, and probably a little better, Mr. Sales said.

There was not a single valid factor in the Canadian economy that even hinted of anything resembling a depression or serious recession in the foreseeable future.

Referring to current monetary controls, Mr. Sales said an important fact was that the money supply had not been reduced; but rather, the rate of increase had been slowed down from an excessive pace.

The policy of restraint was having the desired effect.

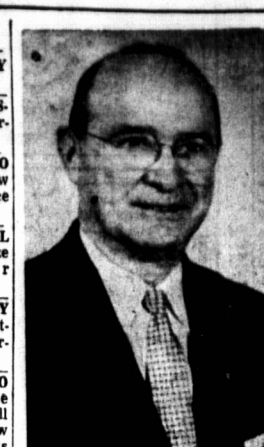

Currencies

MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S. dollar Thursday closed at a discount of 4½ per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 1-16. Pound sterling \$2.87 13-16, down 5-16.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP) — A combination of factors, ranging from technical to international, today breathed some fresh life into the stock market and it staged a moderate advance. Some light selling, especially among index stocks, appeared near the close, however, and the industrials closed below their top for the session.

Observers said underwriting agreements, mining news and other bullish corporate news developments in the Middle East situation to give traders a little less cautious attitude in their dealings.

Coppers, uranium and speculatives were the biggest winners and their gains stimulated interest in other sections of the market. The industrial index closed higher than one-quarter of a point higher than base metals were up nearly a point and western oils a little more than three-quarters of a point.

Campbell Chibougama was ahead 40 cents at \$10.25 and Opekmiska gained ¼ at 10½ to lead coppers higher. Bethlehem, Copper Range, Granduc, Chibougama, Javelin and Bouzan gained 10-20 cents.

Consolidated Denison was up ½ at 20 among uranium. Can-Met recorded a 15-cent rise at \$3.90. Pronto climbed 40 cents to \$7 in light trading. Noranda led senior base metals with a 1½-point gain.

At 4½, Hudson Bay added a point at 78½. Queumont lost ¼ at 15.

Cassiar paced juniors with a 40-cent climb to \$8 and Advocate and Northern Canada each gained 25 cents. Atlin Ruffner was up 17 cents at 81 cents and a turnover of nearly 600,000 shares. Lake Shore Gold lost 15 cents at \$5.20.

Peace River gained a point at 11½ among higher-priced western oil stocks. Calgary and Edmonton and Pacific Pete added fractions. Prairie was up 30 cents to 1.50 and Sooty Rainbow advanced 15 cents to \$3.05. Banff, Canada Oil Lands and Consolidated West Pete lost 12-20 cents.

Index gains: industrials .33 to 448.43; golds 31 to 76.26 base metals 91 to 204.81; western oils .87 to 154.10.
