NEW YORK (AP) — Industrial shares rose for the first time in seven sessions Tuesday as the stock market advanced in fairly active trading.
The Associated Press average of 450 stocks rose 60 cents to 108.70.
For the third straight session, American Motors was the most active stock. It rose 3/4 to 34 1/2 on 400,000 shares.
In the Canadian list, Aluminum Ltd. jumped a point. Also listed were International Nickel, Canadian Pacific, Granby Mining and Walker-Gooderham. Distillers-Seargams, Dome Mines, Hudson Bay Mining and McIntyre Prospecting all closed lower.
American Stock Exchange prices were irregular with an edge to the upside. Brazilian fraction, Jupiter Oils and Sapphire Petroleum were among leaders in the Canadian section. Lower were Canadian Marconi, East Dome,
Hawmigan, Eureka and Preston East Dome.

MONTREAL
MONTREAL (CP) — Prices were irregularly lower in fairly active trading Tuesday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges.
Refining oils and pipelines were down. Trans-Canada Pipeline was off 2 at 3 3/4. Interprovincial Pipeline declined 1/4 at 48 1/4 and Imperial Oil lost 1/4 at 43 1/4.
Down 1/2 in papers were International at 110, Powell River at 1/2 and Price Bros. at 45. Anglo Corp gained 1/2 at 38 1/2, a new high, and B.C. Forest was up 1/2 at 19 1/2, also a new high.
Base metals were generally lower. Noranda lost 1/4 at 52 1/4. Bismuth declined 3/4 at 21. Hudson Bay was off 1/4 at 33 1/2, and Aluminum gained 1/4 at 32.
Up 1/2 in banks were Montreal at 5 1/2 and Commerce at 5 1/4. Banque Canadienne Nationale was up 1/4 at 50, a new high.
Steels were generally lower with Inco off 1/4 at 64. Alva declined 1/4 at 32 1/2, while Dominion Foundries gained 1/4 at 35 1/2.
Down 1/2 in the utilities were North Quebec Power at 26, Quebec Power at 34 and Bathurst Power at 26 1/2. Bell gained 1/4 at 41 1/4.
Metals and oils were lower in a generally narrow range.
Closing averages show banks up 1/2 at 55.31, utilities off 3 at 149, industrials off 1.8 at 286.6, combined off 1.3 at 240.7, papers up 1.2 at 440.3 and golds unchanged at 72.95.

TORONTO (CP) — Most of the stock market was easier Tuesday in light trading.
Final volume of 2,814,000 shares was down from Monday's 3,167,000. It was the lightest volume this month.
Noranda was the big loser among base metals, off 2 at 52. Hudson Bay lost 1/2 and Consolidated Mining and Falconbridge each were off 3/4.
McIntyre was a 1 point loser at 83 among golds. Dome slipped off 1/4 at 14 1/2 while Hollinger eased 1/4 at 27.
Western oils rallied near the close with seniors chopping fractions off their prices. Pembina reduced its 1/4 loss to 1/2 at 9 1/2 and Canadian Husky cut a 1/4 loss to 1/2 at 14 1/2.
Speculative mines were quiet. Can-Erin was the most active, trading 109,000 shares. It was ahead 3 cents at 33 cents.
Index changes: Golds off 1.06 to 81.04 base metals off 1.56 to 175.79; western oils off 30 to 136.52.
