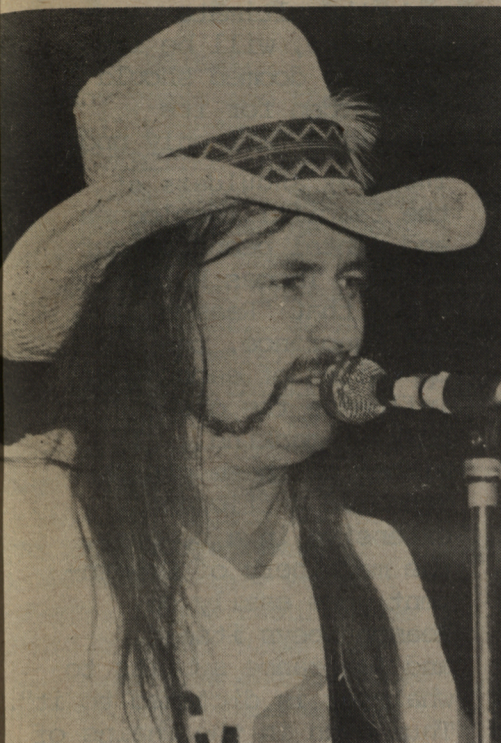


PERFORMS WELL

Regurgitating top 40 hits at the rate of the newest K-Tel album is not and never will be the criteria of a good band. If your own songs are not that strong yet, at least have the guts to make the copped material your own. Rework them to feature YOUR strong points. Airborne does feature an above average lead guitarist and a strong vocalist in the presence of the drummer (sorry I don't know your names yet guys).

Perhaps the only highlight of an otherwise mediocre set of Cars, Kings, and Van Halen songs was a strong rendition of Lynard Skynard's "Alabama".

Despite a good deal of quality music, there were faults at the concert that were non-musical. The rink itself,
