Warns Immediate Shortage Of Newsprint In Prospect

MONTREAL (CP)—R. M. Fowler, president of the Newspaper Association of Canada, Tuesday sounded a warning of an immediate shortage of newsprint.

"The present situation of newsprint supply and demand is causing serious concern and if usage by North American publishers continues at present rates some publishers may be in real distress before the end of the year," Mr. Fowler said in a statement.

Although Canadian and American mills are producing newsprint at an all-time record rate, he said, they are unable to keep pace with the rise in demand, which was totally unexpected a year ago.

Mr. Fowler said that in the last three months American newsprint consumption has been running at an annual rate of 6,750,000 tons and publishers are facing the traditionally heavy demands for advertising in the final quarter of the year.

REDUCTIONS DANGEROUS — Total new supply for U.S. consumers this year will be only a little more than 6,400,000 tons. Total consumption, said the statement, will have to be limited to this amount plus whatever amount can be taken from stocks.

At the end of September U.S. publishers' stocks appeared to be 90,000 tons or eight days' supply below levels of a year ago, which were then thought by publishers to be "necessary minimum levels" to insure against unforeseen inter-

ruption of supply. Mr. Fowler said it is doubtful whether publishers can reduce their stocks more than 100,000 tons below year-end levels of a year ago without encountering serious dangers of individual shortages and possibly the inability of some publishers to continue publication for lack of newsprint.

Canadian newsprint mills have done everything possible, said Mr. Fowler, to meet this unexpected surge of demand from their customers in Canada, the United States and overseas. They now are operating at more than 102 per cent of their 1955 rated capacity. In addition they are installing new capacity at an unprecedented rate and as quickly as possible.

He predicted that total Canadian capacity would increase by 800,000 tons in the years 1955, 1956 and 1957 through investment of more than \$150,000,000, and in the same period U.S. capacity will increase by nearly 600,000 tons.

Canada Offers To Give Atomic Radiation Data

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (CP)—Canada offered Tuesday to tell other countries what it has learned about the effects of atomic radiation.

Health Minister Paul Martin told the UN political committee that "much detailed planning" has gone into Canada's research on the subject and his government would be happy to supply data to a technical committee such as that suggested Monday by the United States.

The U. S. proposed that a committee of scientists from several countries be established to co-ordinate and disseminate information on the effects of radiation.

Among the countries who would nominate scientists to the committee would be those represented on the secretary-general's atomic advisory committee—Canada, Britain, the U. S., France, India, Brazil and Russia.

Martin reviewed steps leading to this year's establishment of a national committee, consisting of experts from government, agencies and Canadian universities, to study the "public health problem" posed by atomic radiation.

PLANS ARE WIDE — At a meeting last May, this committee had recommended three areas for special investigation. The monitoring of certain materials for radioactivity; study of the genetic effects of radiation; and study of the somatic or immediate effects.

CHARGES GRAND JURY — In charging the Grand Jury at the opening of Supreme Court at Georgetown yesterday, Mr. Justice MacGuigan reviewed briefly the two criminal cases on the docket.

In reviewing the charge of murder against Elmer Herbert O'Connor, the Judge said there were no eye witnesses in the deposition of what took place at the MacKenzie home except the statement made by the prisoner. But the evidence showed that there was a struggle or a fight between MacKenzie and the prisoner and that axes and sticks were used with the unfortunate result that MacKenzie was killed.

His Lordship made reference to the statement of O'Connor to Samuel W. MacPherson in which he was quoted as saying, "I killed him" while Mrs. MacKenzie's version of the statement was, "I hit him and I think I killed him."

The Judge also reviewed the evidence of the places that the prisoner had been on the afternoon and the condition he was in. "Some say that he was all right while others say that he was tight and intoxicated." The Judge concluded by saying, "The question for you to decide is whether the accused caused bodily harm which he knew or should have known was likely to cause death, not caring whether death ensued or not. Conduct of this kind has all the earmarks of murder and in my opinion justifies you in bringing in a true bill."

In the case of criminal negligence against Roderick Jerimiah Steele the Judge defined the crime with which the accused is being charged. He pointed out that this was not ordinary negligence that could be satisfied by monetary compensation. He said that it was necessary to satisfy the Court that the negligence alleged was beyond a matter of compen-

sation and that such disregard for the lives and safety of others amounted to a crime against the State of conduct deserving punishment.

The court reminded the Grand Jury that it was not their duty to try the cases but merely to determine whether there is sufficient evidence to warrant having the cases tried by a Petit jury.
