Bail Is Reduced For Mrs. Lemay

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP)—The wife of Canada's most-wanted fugitive had her bail lowered to \$100,000 from \$500,000 in Clark County District Court.

But the sheriff's office said a federal officer was in the courtroom and would serve Mrs. Georges Lemay, 29, with an immigration warrant if she posts bond.

An officer said the next step then would be arraignment before a U.S. commissioner. He said no bail is usually set on an immigration hold.

Mrs. Lemay appeared in court on a hearing on a writ of habeas corpus filed by her lawyer, Harry Claiborne.

Claiborne said the \$100,000 bail, set by Justice of the Peace Delwin Potter at the request of Florida authorities, was excessive and unreasonable.

Mrs. Lemay and her 31-year-old husband were apprehended by the FBI last month on a fugitive warrant.

Florida authorities have said Mrs. Lemay bought his way out of Dade County Jail and escaped with his wife's help after being held on charges in connection with the looting of a Montreal bank of between \$500,000 and \$2,000,000.

Lemay is being held under \$100,000 bail.

Their four-year-old daughter has been taken back to Canada by a relative.

Lemay was arrested in Florida after his photo was seen when flashed around the world via Early-Bird satellite and television stations.

THE first thing you ask your self is the significance of the nine diamonds. You know that it is not a fourth best lead, nor can it be the top of a sequence, since you are looking at the eight. The nine could be the top card of a worthless three card suit, but it is far more likely to come from either a doubleton or a singleton.

If the nine is a singleton, it must be right to take the ace and return a diamond; but if the nine is a doubleton, the proper defense must be to let dummy win the trick with the king, at the same time signaling with the eight to show possession of the ace.

There is no good reason to think that declarer is more apt to have five diamonds than four; on the contrary, he is much more likely to have four diamonds than five. Therefore you permit dummy to win the opening lead and, since, there is no way for declarer to prevent you from later giving partner a ruff, you eventually defeat the contract.
