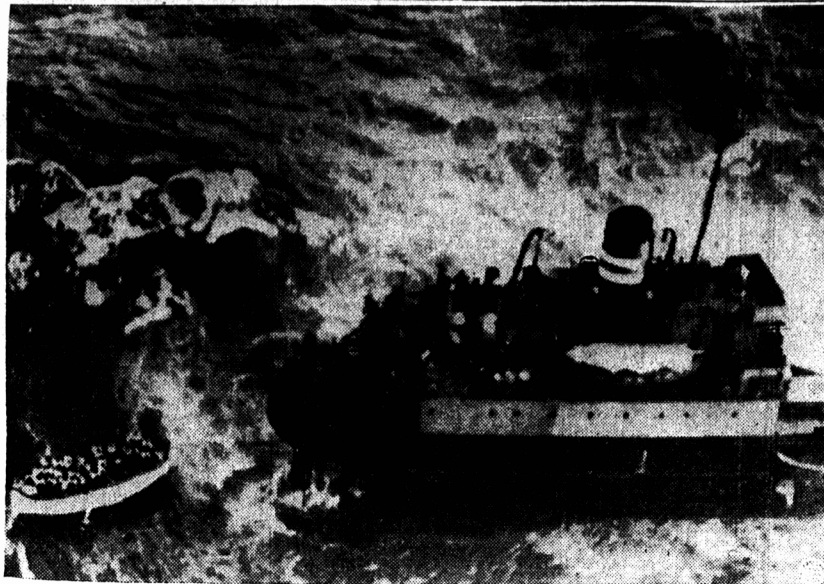


Jack Adams Fined \$500

MONTREAL, (CP) — President Clarence Campbell of the National Hockey League announced Tuesday that Jack Adams, general manager of Detroit Red Wings, has been fined \$500 for "accosting referee

Red Storey in the corridor and entering his dressing room at Detroit Olympia." Adams violated the league's by-laws Jan. 18 between periods when Montreal Canadiens played the Red Wings. A few weeks ago Bill Tobin, general manager of Chicago Black Hawks, was also fined \$500 for a similar violation. Adams and Tobin are league governors for their respective teams.

At Melbourne, J. Cain, Premier of Victoria, sent a cable Monday to Avery Brundage of Chicago, international Olympic committee president, inviting him to Melbourne to inspect the grounds. There has been much discussion on determining the Olympic site. Brundage, irked by Australia's uncertain preparations, has hinted that the games might be transferred to some other city. He mentioned that Rome and Los Angeles were "practically ready" to handle the games. The conference estimated the cost of holding the games in Melbourne at \$850,000 about \$1,012,500. The Commonwealth government will raise half of this and the Victorian government, along with the Melbourne city council, will share the remainder. Meanwhile, the Melbourne Cricket Ground trustees have agreed to extend accommodations to handle 120,000 persons.
