## Education Minister Assures Co-operation

Education Minister L.G. Dewar last night said that to the best of his knowledge all correspondence is promptly taken care of at the department of education, and any information available is given at all times. The minister was commenting on what he called "strong criticism" concerning lack of co-operation by his department which appeared in an article in a Prince Edward Island weekly.

Dr. Dewar said that with respect to boards of trustees and other delegations or persons visiting the department, courtesy and attention is provided at all times.

He pointed out that, especially in Kings County, a great deal of activity has taken place during the past year with respect to the consolidation of schools and the department has endeavored to co-operate 100 per cent with school boards in the preliminary stages, planning buildings, having architects plans prepared and also in interim financing and floating of bond issues where necessary.

### PROBLEMS

Many problems arose and were dealt with until some solution satisfactory to the department and boards concerned was obtained.

The department has co-operated in printing pamphlets, organizing meetings and providing officials at the various meetings. He said a special word of commendation should be given to the supervisory staff for many hours of planning and consultation in drawing up an overall plan of consolidation. This has been progressing over the past two or three years. The department is prepared to receive any valid criticism and would appreciate any specific instances where co-operation was not received, Dr. Dewar said.

### RODEO WINNERS

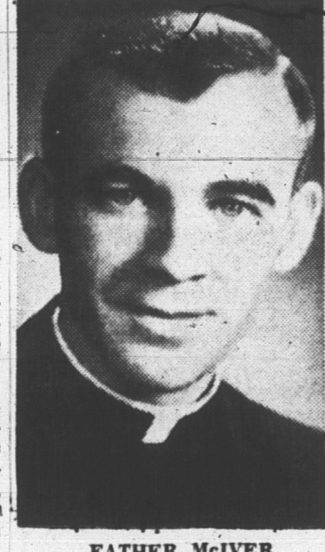
