### Dooittle Warns Russia May Get Ahead Of U.S.

BY DOUGLAS B. CORNELL WASHINGTON (AP)—Lt. Gen. Dooittle testified Tuesday before the U.S. staff leads Russia in military strength but there is a real, sobering threat that "she will overtake us."

"Certainly, said the retired rear admiral, Russia already is ahead on intermediate and intercontinental ballistic missiles. The U.S., he said, is in "a time of crisis."

Dr. John P. Hagen, Canadian-born chief of the U.S. satellite program, told investigating senators the U.S. could have beaten the Soviet Union into the air with an earth satellite. Russia's first Sputnik was placed in orbit Oct. 4.

COULD HAVE WON Questioned by Senator Estes Kefauver (Dem., Tenn.), Hagen said he had been given top priority for all the things that go with money, money and materials—we certainly could have improved the delivery dates we now have and certainly been ahead of the Russians.

Hagen is director of the navy's Vanguard satellite project. Dooittle said he didn't think America's intelligence consistently had underestimated Russian strength and progress. He said he thought who interested it did.

Hagen, an astronomer born in Amherst, N.S., said his assignment was to put a satellite into orbit, one which could be recovered and send back valuable scientific information within the International Geophysical Year. The IGY stretches from last July through December 1958.

TESTS SUCCESSFUL Hagen said all tests of the three-stage launching vehicle have been successful beyond his expectations. But he cautions that there is anything to report of a speeding.

The intention, as it has been all along, he said, is to launch one of the small test satellites.
