Borax Beneficial To Crop Plants

(Experimental Farms Note) The use of borax as a corrective for certain plant diseases, particularly brown heart of turnips, is now receiving considerable attention in Canada. Findings of the Dominion Experimental Farms System show that finely powdered borax applied directly in the drill at the rate of 10 to 15 pounds per acre satisfactorily controlled this important turnip disease on most soils. There were few exceptions where lime was heavily applied or the soil was naturally highly alkaline.
