 build and share.

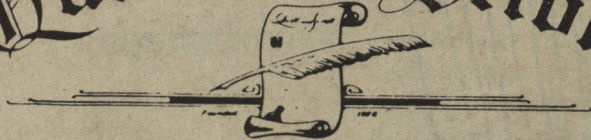
