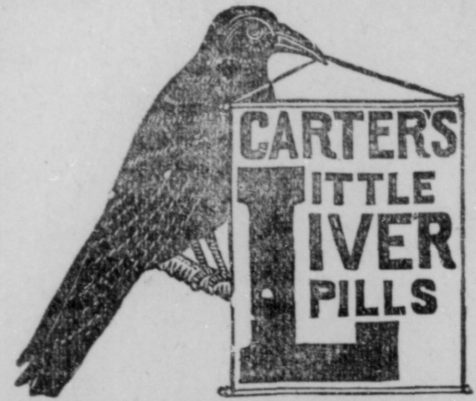

When Lincoln Died.
