

**SUMMERSIDE DRIVE ROUTE**

The map above indicates the route the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh will follow this evening when they arrive by air from London at Summerside. They will drive from the airport along the highway through St. Eleanor's and then make a right turn down to the Town of Summerside, taking a direct path to the government wharf to board the Royal Yacht Britannia, which will bring them overnight to Charlottetown, arriving just before noon today.

**EDITION IS BOTH SOUVENIR, GUIDE**

As the spotlight of world interest centres on Prince Edward Island with greater intensity than ever before—as great occasions follow each other in swift succession on Oct. 5, 6 and 7—this special edition is presented both as a souvenir and as a guide to what is taking place.

There is much to commemorate, following the arrival tonight of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and His Royal Highness Prince Philip. Yet there is also a feeling among Islanders that they are welcoming Her Majesty both as an old friend and as their Queen, for this is her third visit here. She has been most gracious in making it possible for all who wish to see her—particularly the young, the aged and the incapacitated—to do so during the extensive tours that have been arranged for the Royal party.

In this edition, detail maps are presented showing Royal tours, and indicating events to be attended by Her Majesty and Prince Philip, for each of the three days they will be in the province.

To enrich the souvenir characteristics of the editions, many pictures of members of the Royal Family which have never before appeared in Canada are presented. These have been secured through the co-operation of The Scotsman, of Edinburgh, The Sunday Times, of London, and the British Information Office.

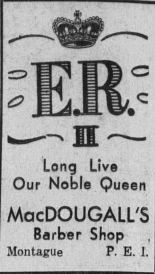

er. On 14th October H.M. opened the 23rd Canadian Parliament, the first Sovereign to open the Canadian Parliament in person. From 16th to 21st October H.M. and H.R.H. visited the U.S.A., where they visited the Jamestown Festival, stayed in Washington as guests of President Eisenhower, and visited New York where the Queen addressed a special meeting of the United Nations General Assembly.

1961 Visit to west coast of Africa November-December, including Ghana, Sierra Leone, The Gambia, and Liberia. The Queen and the Duke flew home from Dakar on 6th December.
