Quebec Suggested Leading Canada to New Autonomy

QUEBEC (CP) — Power in Quebec, in its quest for control of its economy, may be leading it to a greater autonomy than any other province in Canada, according to a report by a professor of political science here.
He interpreted the Quebec election results Wednesday as support for the Liberal government's "positive" policies of nationalism.
"Even in the case where nationalism is never heard of, such as the Lower St. Lawrence, candidates put great stress on being the masters of our own destiny," Professor Dion noted that opposition leader Daniel Johnson had forced the government to agree to its record, rather than campaign for election on a power issue alone.
"Which mandate was put into question by Mr. Johnson and the whole mandate was freely given by the people of the government," said Professor Dion. "The Liberals provided the masters of our own destiny."

Quebec, through its policies at all getting along with its own resources, was pulling away from the United States, not Canada.
Professor Dion said the negative nationalism that once led to the federal universal grants and participation in such joint programs as federal university grants and the Trans-Canada Highway, has disappeared in the last two years.

Bishop Ousted For Campaign Against Voodoo

SANTO DOMINGO, Dominican Republic (AP) — Haiti's government has ordered the deportation of Bishop Paul Robert and his staff as one of the reasons his campaign against voodoo in Haiti. Three other French-born Roman Catholic clergymen also were ordered deported.
Reports from the Haitian capital, Port au Prince, indicated President Francois Duvalier was reopening his ban on voodoo, a ban that the church, Duvalier is a doctor of ethnology and on folk religions with tolerance and more than average interest.
The three priests, identified only as Rev. Robin, Rev. George Martin and Rev. Saul, are expected to leave Port au Prince by commercial airliner today for New York via St. Martin.

OTTAWA (CP) — Transit of ocean vessels from the Great Lakes via the St. Lawrence Seaway will likely cause congestion, perhaps seriously so if the weather worsens, the seaway authority has warned.
