Studebaker Love Greeted With Deight in Hamilton

Studebaker, a firm that built its name on the road in the United States, has come to Canada to start anew.
The oldest name in U.S. automobile production is halting its manufacturing at South Bend, Ind., and will move to Hamilton in an attempt to turn losses into profits.
The company announced last Monday that production, which will be curtailed, will be shifted entirely to its Hamilton plant.
The switch was joyously greeted by Gordon E. Grundy, 51, president of Studebaker Canada Ltd., and by the city of Hamilton.
Mr. Grundy said the move was a "wonderful opportunity for Canada" and would also increase employment and production.
"This will be the first truly Canadian auto operation of its kind, staffed with its own research and design engineers and free to develop a distinctive Canadian car," he said.
At Hamilton, the city greeted the move as the most important event since establishment of the steel industry 100 years ago. Mayor Charles D. Stewart, who moved to Hamilton in 1903, said the move "is a great opportunity for the city to develop Studebaker into a major industry for an employment and payroll standpoint."

The company's sales in the U.S. have fallen sharply, and it has been unable to turn a profit for several years. N.Y. Stocks Gain Slightly In Confused Week's Trading

NEW YORK (AP)—Amid confused trends caused by year-end transactions based on tax considerations, the stock market squeaked out a slight gain last week. It was the market's first straight weekly rise.
The Dow Jones industrial average did not confirm the rise. This closely-watched 30-stock barometer took a net loss of .08 at 790.77.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks, however, rose 1.1 to a historic high of 284.32. Standard and Poor's broad 500-stock index gained .05 to 41.06.
It was a cautious market, with volume at 21,884,940 shares compared with 24,100,000 the previous week — the highest turnover for any full five-day trading week since the week ended Oct. 5, when 21,502,900 shares changed hands.
Although the Dow Jones average rose on every day but Monday, when it dipped slightly, most stock declines that advanced in every session except Friday and Saturday were small. The week's 724 fell and 807 rose.

STEEL STOCKS GAIN
The verdict of a slightly higher market was based on the steel industry, which has had a strong week. Steel stocks, which have been underperforming the market, saw a significant gain. The steel industry's production is expected to remain strong in the coming months.

STUDEBAKER FADES
Studebaker's plans to end its car manufacturing in the United States and transfer these operations to Hamilton, Ont., boosted the stock at the beginning but, as analysts considered costs involved in the switch, Studebaker faded and took a fractional net loss on the week.

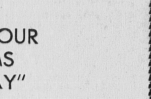
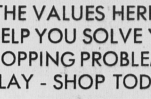
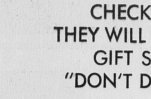
