## CONTRACT BRIDGE

So when a hand comes to my attention where someone shines on opening lead, as Lady Doris Rhodes, English Star, did on this one, it is a privilege to report it. There are two main guides to the opening lead. One is the 13 cards held by the opening leader, and the other is the bidding that has taken place.

Lady Rhodes (West) considered the bidding carefully. It was obvious that the opponents, having used Blackwood, were not missing two aces. It was apparent also that whatever tricks were coming to the defense would have to come from the spade suit.

On the bidding, it was possible, though not likely, that East had found the king of spades. But if, as was more probable, either North or South held the king, there was not much chance to defeat the contract by leading the ace of spades. Declarer would be practically sure to take the rest of the tricks with the lead of the spade ace.

So Lady Rhodes opened a low spade, hoping dummy would show up with the king and that her partner would have the queen.

The setup was ideal. Her wish was granted. Declarer could not be blamed for playing low from dummy. South could scarcely fathom the bold underlead of an ace against a slam. East won with the queen, returned a spade, got a ruff, and declarer went down two. It was the only lead to beat the contract.

## Low-Cost Items Stopped By Japs

OTTAWA (CP) — The Japanese government has suspended temporarily the shipment to Canada by Japanese exports of a wide range of finished, low-cost textiles at the request of the Canadian government, it was learned Thursday.

An official of the Japanese Embassy said the Canadian government made the request as a result of pressure from the section of the Canadian textile industry which produces finished goods. He said the industry complained that it could not compete with the lower-cost imports from Japan.

## Interest Rate Jumps Again

OTTAWA (CP) — The Bank of Canada interest rate this week increased for the third straight week to 5.47 per cent, the central bank reported Thursday.

The rate compares with 5.42 per cent last week and 5.38 the week previous. The all-time low of 1.12 per cent was set last Aug. 2.

The rate climbed nine consecutive weeks, to 5.30 per cent four weeks ago, then dropped to 5.15 and increased weekly since.

The rate is set at one-quarter of one cent above the average yield of 91-day treasury bills. This week the average yield was 5.22 per cent, compared to 5.17 a week ago.

## AVERAGE PRICE

Average price paid for the new issue of \$116,000,000 worth of 91-day government bills was \$98.714 compared to \$98.728 last week.

Average yield on \$20,000,000 of 182-day bills was 5.42 per cent, compared with 5.36 a week ago. Average price was \$97.369. The 91-day bills mature Sept. 18 and the 182-day bills Dec. 18.

Another \$135,000,000 issue, made up of \$115,000,000 worth of 91-day bills and \$20,000,000 in 182-day bills, will be made next Thursday.

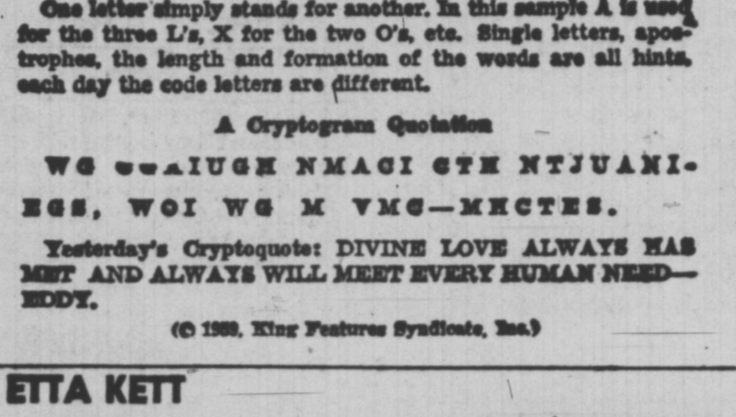

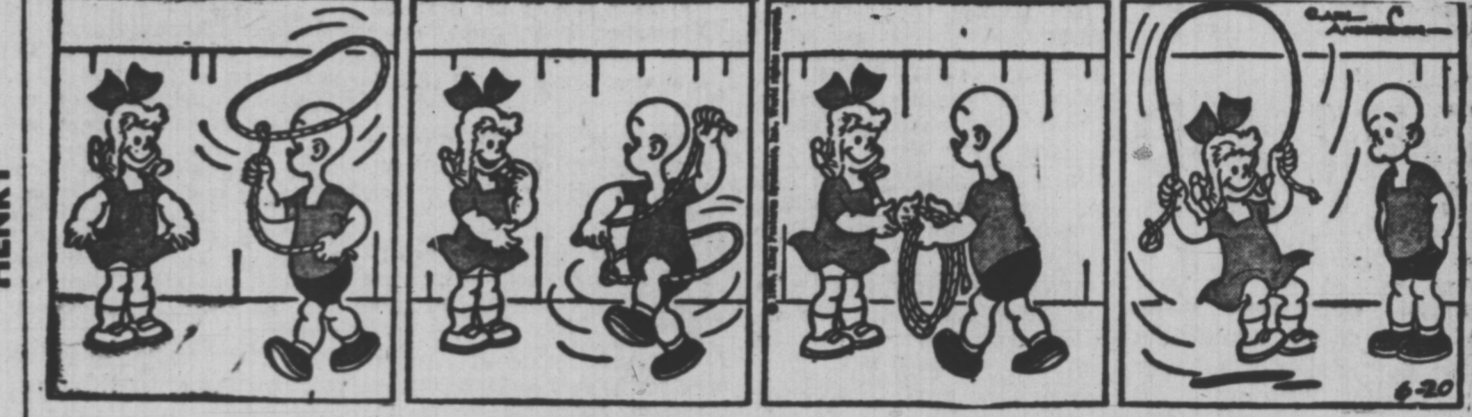
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
