**Quebec Man Draws Two Sweep Tickets**

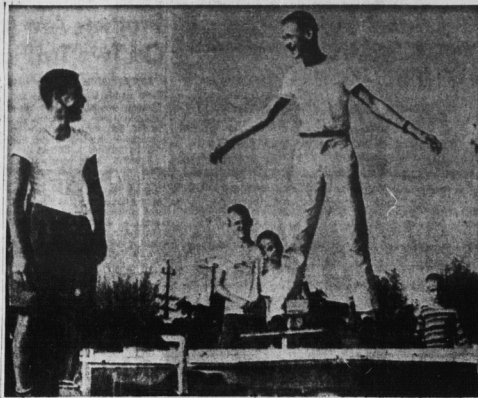
DUBLIN (CP)—A Canadian from Quebec province beat astronomical mathematical odds Tuesday when two of his tickets were drawn on two horses in the year's third Irish Sweepstakes. Tickets bearing the name Ubaldo Bellefeuille and the address St. Francois, Que., were drawn on Early to Rise and Cocky Boy, both eligible for the Cambridgehire Handicap to be run at Newmarket, England, Saturday. It is not yet known whether either horse will be a starter.

The ticket on Early to Rise was numbered NBT 6147, and that on Cocky Boy carried the number NBT 6145, indicating they might have been from the same book.

It was not known whether the name on the tickets was a non-de-plume or the holder's actual name. The address also was in doubt, since the Canadian Almanac lists 10 towns in Quebec with St. Francois included in their names, but no St. Francois Sud.

Tickets were being drawn Tuesday on the last 44 of 88 horses eligible for the Cambridgehire. On the drawing for the first \$2, 184 Canadian tickets were drawn. All tickets drawn win prizes based on the amount of the pool, with extra amounts for tickets on horses which actually start in Saturday's race.

Holders of tickets on the winner will receive about \$100,000 with prizes of about \$50,000 for the second horse and about \$30,000 for the third.

**Branch Rail Line In Que. Set For Official Opening**

MATAGAMI, Que. (CP) — A \$20,000,000 branch rail line is to be opened officially here today, bringing this booming mining centre 400 air miles northwest of Ottawa into rail contact with the rest of Canada. The 46-mile line, which took more than two years to build, will serve a new township of 8,000 people and haul out the zinc and copper ore produced by three mines. The mines—Matagami Lake Mines Limited, Orphan Mines Limited and New Hogo Mines Limited — expect to produce 8,000 tons of ore a day.
