

### Final Exams This Week Lead Up To Graduation

While the Stanley Cup finals alternate between Montreal and Chicago and the baseball season begins its six months schedule, the students of St. Dunstan's bear down on the nerve wracking task of writing the final exams, the fastidious chore that started on Thursday and extends to next Friday, at least for some students.

After the finals, the upper classmen will stay around to make the necessary preparations for the graduation on Tuesday and the prom that night. Thus for the graduating Seniors, their days at St. Dunstan's are indeed numbered.

Indications are that approximately 60 students will receive their scrolls in the four degree courses offered. Amazingly enough, perhaps as high as 25 per cent of the class will go on for post-graduate work of some kind, one of the highest percentages in years.

Although lacking some of the real stalwarts of some of the past years, this class has indeed made its mark in the annals of St. Dunstan's. Every graduating class receives the underclassmen's assessment, and this year is no exception. They pass with honors. They have an excellent percentage of their number associated with athletics and students' Council activities, as well as possessing the all important academic standing.

Among their ranks who have received the Students' Union "D's", the highest recognition given, are Gene Kimch, president of the AAA; Dan Kimch, president of class; Gerry FitzGerald, president of the Students' Union; Mary Donovan, editor of the Year Book; and Roger MacDonald, Editor of the Red and White.

In varsity sports, the two standouts have been Bob Francoeur and Len Sirois, both of

Rumford, Me. Despite the fact that the basketball team failed to win any Maritime championships in past few years, these have always finished in the top 10 in scoring, and this year, Sirois received the singular honor of landing on the first all star team, quite a feat for a player on a last place team.

And so the story goes. But before the Seniors pull out on the 11th, there will be plenty to keep them busy. Next week, the Alumni Association will put on the annual dinner for the graduates. Then on Sunday, there is the Baccalaureate Service and Mass, followed by a buffet supper.

Tuesday climaxes the activities with the graduation exercises. Three Doctor of Laws degrees will be given, honours causa, to Professor Henri Blanchard, Mr. Justice Mark McGulgan, both of Charlottetown, and Dr. Colin B. MacKay, president of the University of New Brunswick. Dr. MacKay will also give the address to the graduates.

But how do the graduating class members feel about the whole thing, now that they have finished their four year tenure at St. Dunstan's? After four years, they must have some reflections on it, especially after this year when so much has taken place, what with the hockey, the new Coffee Shop, the Royal Commission report, the announcement of the new science building, et al. ## Hees Reports No Plan To Meet Leon Balcer

MONTREAL (CP) — George Hees, looked on by many as a possible future candidate for leadership of the Progressive Conservative party, said here he has no plans to meet Leon Balcer to discuss the future of the party in Quebec.

Mr. Balcer, former Quebec leader, resigned from the party April 7 after a series of clashes with Opposition Leader Diefenbaker over the party's policies towards Quebec. Mr. Balcer, member for Trois-Rivieres, now sits in the Commons as an independent.

In a prepared statement, Mr. Hees referred to reports published Wednesday that Mr. Balcer "indicated to the press that he expected to have a meeting with me to discuss the future of the Conservative party in Quebec."

Mr. Hees, former Conservative trade minister and now president of the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges, added: "He (Mr. Balcer) has not been in touch with me to suggest such a meeting and in view of his statement when he resigned from the party, I do not expect that he will.

"When he resigned from the Conservative party, Mr. Balcer made it very clear that he intends to remain as an independent, and it appeared that he had no more interest in the future of the Conservative party. If this did not represent Mr. Balcer's feelings and intentions about the party he should, without delay, make his position clear and join with others in assisting the party in any way possible.

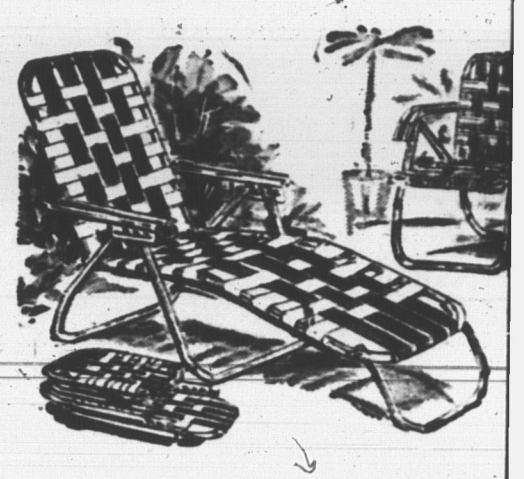

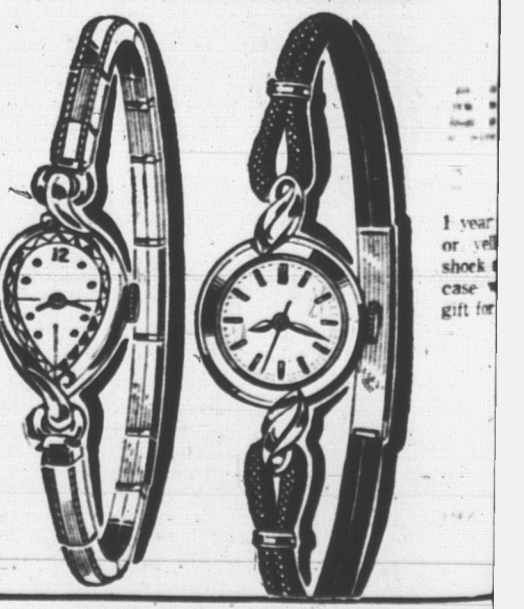
