

## DENTAL CLINICS

IN CHARLOTTETOWN and SUMMERSIDE

For Applying Sodium Fluoride for the Partial Prevention of Tooth Decay.

This treatment is being given in the Dental Clinics in the City Hall, Charlottetown, and in the Health Centre, Summerside, during the summer months. It is available without charge to all children in these centres or outside who are THREE to FIVE YEARS of age. Younger or older children are not eligible. Four visits are necessary at weekly intervals.

Only a limited number of children can be treated. If the demand is excessive, preference will be given to the earlier applicants. Requests for appointments should be made to the Division of Dental Public Health, Department of Health and Welfare.

few people about. The great original pine forest dominated the mountain top. The tower, the lake and the profusion of bloom on the trees, shrubs and great borders and beds of flowers, added to the feeling of seclusion and reverence, as the great songs and hymns of the past and present rang out from the Carillon as played by the master Carillonneur, Anton Brees, of Duke University. The melodies were awe inspiring and the people stood in silence, or set in shady nooks to enjoy that hallowed place.

In 1953 we had gone only a short distance from Lake Wales, on the Sanctuary Boulevard, when we were bumper to bumper in the throng of cars that extended for miles. The car was stopped for longer periods than it moved forward as a snail's pace. Great areas have been cleared for parking spaces. We were stopped for a parking ticket, and even then had to walk most of the way up the mountain, past thousands of parked cars.

There had been many additional plantings of shrubs and flowers and sprinklers were active in many areas, but the seclusion of the Sanctuary was gone. The Tower and the surroundings were all wonderfully beautiful though marred by ropes to keep the crowds in place. The carillon, however, which is tuned on the Taylor True Harmonic System, and played with Anton Brees' individual expression, came out through the singing Tower to make up in part for the peace and quiet that had formerly been so inspiring and soothing.

Words fail to describe the superb architecture of the grey and pink marble Tower. It has often been called "the Taj Mahal of America". It may not rival that exquisite tomb in India, but it does give forth, from its seventy-one

bells of the Carillon, which range over four and one half octaves, music that is noted for perfection of tone and a sweetness that extends from its smallest bell, weighing eleven pounds, to the giant Bourdon Bell, which weighs twenty three thousand pounds. It is also called the "Tenor Bell" and its note is E flat.

As we returned to Lake Wales, still bumper to bumper, we felt well repaid for our sojourn visit to this musical Mecca, presented to the people for their enjoyment by a great citizen Edward W. Bok. The great height from which the Carillon is played, spreads the music outward so that it seems as if the whole structure were singing.

This Singing Tower of Florida, completed in 1926, and the mountain Lake Sanctuary were dedicated in 1928 by Calvin Coolidge, President of the United States. He and Mrs. Coolidge also planted the two Sabal palms in the Glade, each marked by a bronze plaque. Each Easter morning a Sunrise Service is held in the Sanctuary, where everyone is welcome, and a Carillon recital follows, with others at noon and at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. During the 1952-53 Carillon Season Dec. 2nd to April 30th, 1953, ninety five Recitals were given from the Bok Singing Tower.

Their great success has been the lengthening of the life span by twenty years during the past fifty years.

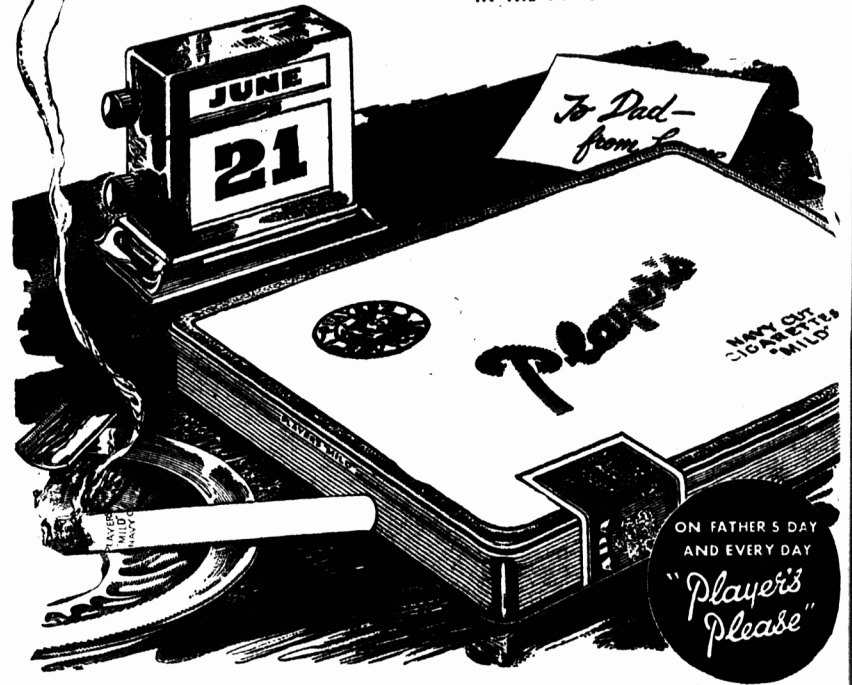
