

Auditor-General Has Criticism Of Some Defence Dept. Items

 OTTAWA (CP)—The RCAF in 1961 went ahead with purchase of "bomb toss computers" for the CF-104 jet bomber through three months earlier it had discontinued training on the type of weapon the computer was designed to deliver.

In 1963, all these computers were removed from the CN-104s and in 1964 the RCAF disposed of them, together with all tooling, test equipment and spares.

The cost: \$7,210,000.

This is one of several cases of defence department spending which Auditor General Maxwell Henderson questions in his annual report, submitted to Parliament.

The report says the reason the RCAF gave for going ahead with the purchase of the obsolete computers was "to give flexibility of weapon employment for the future."

It showed where to drop the computer showed the pilot of a CF-104 when and where to drop his bomb—that is, when to begin the "bomb toss."

The report says that as early as August, 1960, it became known that another type of weapon would very likely become available which would not require the bomb toss equipment.

Three months later, it was decided to equip the CF-104 with two weapons delivery devices: The "dual timer" as well as the bomb toss computer. The former cost \$1,400 an aircraft compared with \$21,900 for the latter.

By July, 1962, the report says, it was determined that the dual timer could do the job of the bomb toss computer just as accurately. But it still was January, 1963, before the decision was made to remove the bomb toss computers.

Other defence department cases listed by the auditor-general:

Six cases were found where servicemen released on pension had been credited with pensionable service dating in one case from the age of nine and in the five others from ages 11 and 12.

CANCELLED PROGRAM
 —Canada and the U.S. in 1963 cancelled a program for gap-filler or low-level radars when it was found proper radars couldn't be developed soon enough. Cost to Canada for property rights and construction: \$3,500,000.

Nine naval officers travelled in their own cars from Halifax to Victoria on temporary duty at a cost to the department of \$5,282. The cost would have been \$682 by RCAF aircraft.

The department entered a new agreement to buy natural gas at 23 cents a 1,000 cubic feet for Camp Wainwright, Alta., although it held an option under the previous agreement to buy gas for another four years at 21 cents.

The RCAF bought 3,400 electrical relays from a U.S. firm for \$5,000. They were defective but the firm refused to refund the money. The instruments were turned over to Crown Assets Disposal Corp. and sold for \$610 to the firm that made them originally.

During the 1964-65 fiscal year, 391 servicemen age 40 and under were retired with pensions totalling \$472,000 annually. One 32-year-old serviceman was awarded a full pension though discharged because he had been overweight for four years.

In June, 1963, 514 acres were expropriated at Penhold, Alta., to extend the runways of the RCAF station there for jet training. It was then found civilian airways were too near to permit jet training. Cost: \$15,000.

ARMED SERVICES TRADESMEN MAY GET PAY BOOST

OTTAWA (CP)—Defence Minister Hellyer has hinted in the Commons skilled tradesmen in the armed forces will be given a pay increase.

In a reply to Marcel Lambert (PC—Edmonton West), the minister said he was not forecasting a pay increase but his department must be "realistic."

He told Robert Thompson, Social Credit leader, that his department is having the same trouble as every other organization in competing for skilled manpower.

Mr. Hellyer said the department would see what it could do to put it in a better position to compete with industry for skilled workers.

Pay for pilots would have to be carefully considered because commercially attractive offers to RCAF aircrew.

David Gross (L.—Victoria, B.C.), a former naval officer, said the U.S. pays bonuses up to \$10,000 for a man to sign on for further tours of duty in the armed forces.

Douglas Harkness, former Conservative defence minister, asked whether it were not true that the shortage of personnel was due primarily to low morale because of integration.

Speaker Lucien Lamoureux ruled the question out of order before reply.

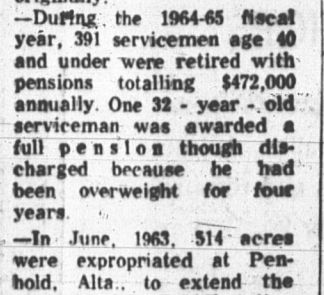
Opening lead—four of spades. Here is a remarkable hand played in the men's pair championship in Portland, Ore., in 1964.

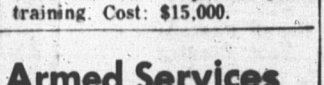
But, when the hand was played, South did reach a slam on the bidding shown and furthermore made the slam in relatively easy style.

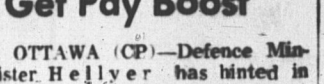

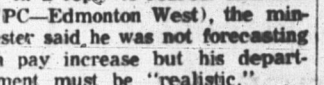

BELL TELEPHONE CO. PROFIT CLAIMED TOO HIGH 6 YEARS

TORONTO (CP)—The Bell Telephone Co. has for more than six years made more profit than authorized by the board of transport commissioners and the provincial government has not once "protested this exploitation of the consumer," the Ontario legislature was told here.

Donald C. MacDonald, New Democratic Party leader, speaking during the debate on the speech from the throne, said the government "has sat idly by" each time Bell has sought a rate increase.

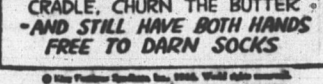
He said one per cent of the company's gross telephone revenues are paid to American Telephone and Telegraph under the terms of a management contract and patent pool; considerable amounts of Bell's profits are drained off into the profits subsidiaries and affiliates; and the company maintains an excessively expensive non-contributory pension plan.

By 1964, Bell's over-all capital through the allowed level was 5.9 per cent and common equity earnings were 7.3 per cent compared with the 6.6 per cent level permitted.

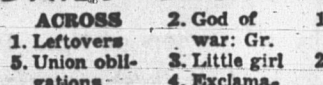

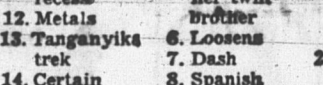
