Island Potato Acreage Decreased

OTTAWA, July 20 (CP) - The Bureau of Statistics today placed total wheat acreage in Canada this year at 26,964,200 acres, compared with 27,540,700 in 1949. In a preliminary estimate, the Bureau placed spring wheat acreage at 25,095,200, compared with 26,735,700 last year and winter wheat acreage at 869,000, compared with 805,000.
