That just Betty's Bark—Mr. Rock battle Saturday last in the second dash of the free-for-all was just about as thrilling an affair as any race fan would want to see.

This past Monday night some terrific finishes were served up to the race fans. In the AA pace Ginger E stepped in 2.11 to photo out Betty French in the first mile of the fast class. It was a great performance by the 7-year-old son of Ginger who copied his second victory of the young season. He had to be in top shape as Dave Wisener took Betty French down the homelane in a terrific hurry.

Next trip of this class saw Joey Arsenault get Peter Federal away on top at the first turn and the Mapoo Stables entry refused to let anyone near him from then on. Betty French again gave chase but once more the Guy French mare just missed it by a head.

ANDY PERRY'S GALLANT WAY was a surprise winner in both trips of the A trot and pace.

The Summerside trotter never made a mistake and managed to nip an on-rushing Bernie Dan in both trips. The heavily-backed Lady Lakeburn didn't have it at all Monday night, going to bad breaks in both dashes. The high-stepping mare was never in contention.

It was the last dash of the night that probably provided the evening's greatest thrill. Joe Hennessy gave the Bernie Dan a whisker. In fact it was so close that many fans thought Bernie had nipped out Gallant Way but the photo never lies.

FROM HERE ON the racing should improve each night.

This coming Saturday and Monday two more cards are on the racing menu and they give every promise of producing more thrills than at any previous time this year.

We believe the interest will increase with each race card and that from here on attendances will be large. The race game is a triangle affair, involving the track operators, the horsemen and the fans. Each one needs the other for the success of the venture.

We believe that the interests of the public should be preserved and it is indeed good business to see to it that nothing happens to sour the race fans. The folks who toss their money over the mutual wickets are a mighty important group as far as the game is concerned. If anything happens to stop that transfer, then the association and the horsemen suffer in a great hurry.

And so it is with this in mind that we commend the judges for fining all drivers in that second mile of the A pace. These horses went to the half in 1:12.1, anything like a satisfactory performance. The judges didn't like what they saw and all six drivers drew fines as a result.

FOLKS WHO BET on the races don't expect to win every time they place a wager. However, they do expect to get a drive and nobody can blame them for that. There was much grumbling after that dash Monday night and when announcer Frank Acorn stated that all drivers got hit in the pocketbook, there was a mighty roar of approval from the folks in attendance.

The time to nip this thing is right at the start. If drivers see they can't fool around, then they'll be in there driving from wire to wire.

We don't expect to see any repetition of that dash for the rest of the season. We are looking forward to all-out drives at each card from here till the final card of 1959.

It shapes up like the best racing season that Prince Edward Island has ever experienced.

Let's enjoy it to the fullest.

DOWN THE BACK STRETCH

At Yorkers Raceway last Friday night, the feature event was won by Speedy Pick, time 1:39.2-5—the fastest mile paced on a half-mile track this season.

Saturday night's racing card at the Charlottetown track was a dandy, and the promoters were fortunate in that the weather held good right through with the end. Other Maritime tracks were not so fortunate, and the program at Sackville Downs had to be postponed until Monday night.

We were pleased to see the little pacing mare, Nellie Bangs, driven by Joe Hennessy, win the first dash on the program in 2:15; the writer owned Nellie a couple of years ago and knows that she has a lot of brush. She is now owned by L.A. Jordan. Colonel Henry's win of the other dash in the D trot and pace was a nice effort, with the mile a second faster—2:18.

Everyone got a great deal of pleasure in seeing the four-year-old pacer, Norine Clegg, with driver Bert Dickie, win the second and sixth dashes. She showed terrific speed over the ice last winter and seemed to win pretty handily in 2:15.35 and 2:15.1. She should take a record of between 2:12 and 2:13 later on. Our congratulations to owners Webster and Reeves.

The "AA" Pace brought out a field of six pacers that have all been good performers, and it looked difficult to pick a winner, but Jean Clegg sailed right in front and was never headed in either dash, time 2:14.35 and 2:15. Her last quarter in the third dash was paced in 31.15, and her final quarter in the seventh race was paced in 31 seconds which shows she had plenty left and marks her as capable of pacing in 2:12 or better. She is owned, was driven, and has been given all her training by Sidney Stead.

THE FREE FOR ALL

Everyone was waiting for the free-for-all with a good field of pacers, and they got a real surprise when the locally-bred Just Betty's Mark, owned by Mrs. Donald Seaman and driven by Don Seaman, that was an added starter in the place of War Cry Ranger 2.08, led four pacers with record of 1:58.4-5—2:08.1-5, to the wire.

The whole field had loafed to the three-quarter pole, which was reached in 1.43.35; then they really got underway and came flying through the stretch with Just Betty's Mark winning by a small margin in 2:14.16. Mr. Rock 2:08.2-5, was second; Sky Prince 2:08.3-5, was third; Bertram Hanover 2:08.3-5, was fourth; and Sir Joseph 1:58.4-5, was fifth.

In the final dash of this event, we saw what we believe was the second fastest mile paced in the Maritimes this season. There was probably some encouragement from the stand, and also from the drivers of the horses. Mr. Rock 2:08.2-5, driven by Cyril Smith, won by a head from Just Betty's Mark in 2:10.2-5, which is just a fifth of a second slower than the season's record.
