MONTREAL (CP) — The United States dollar in terms of Canadian funds was unchanged at \$1.07.

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market made its seventh straight daily rise Friday and pushed the Dow Jones industrial average once more above the significant 900 level at the close.

Trading was active, volume totalling 5,840,000 shares compared with 6,690,000 Thursday. The Dow industrials rose 5.58 to 903.48.

Of 1,360 issues traded, 557 rose and 532 fell. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 5 to 336.1.

The industrial section of the list was receded by, among others, Du Pont, up 3/4, General Motors, up 2 1/2, Eastman Kodak, up 1/2, Kennecott, up 1/2, and Woolworth, up 1/4.

U.S. Rubber was weak, sinking 1 1/2 on news that Indonesia has assumed management of the company's rubber plantation in Sumatra.

With plans of their merger fully reported, there was some profit taking in Pepsi Cola, which lost 2, and Frito-Lay, which fell 1/2.

Douglas Aircraft advanced 1 1/2 following news that Eastern gave Douglas an order for 384,000 worth of jet aircraft.

Most steels took fractional losses. Motors were mixed, oil lower and aerospace a little higher.

Among Canadian issues traded, Hudson Bay Mining rose 1 1/2, International Nickel, Granby Mining and Aluminum Ltd. gained 1/4 each.

Prices on the American exchange were irregularly higher by a thin margin. Volume was 1,800,000 shares compared with 1,900,000 Thursday.

MONTREAL (CP) — Utilities were the only casualty in moderately active trade Friday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges.

The industrial volume was 294,000 shares and mines and oils turnover 1,648,100. The composite index rose 0.1 to 163.2, only 1.9 points under its all-time peak.

Banks were up 0.3 to 136.2. Royal added 1/4 to 82 1/2 while Toronto-Dominion and Banque Canadienne Nationale each rose 1/4 to 60 1/2 and 74, respectively.

Papers were up 0.2 to 145.7. Price Bros. added a point to 47 and Abitibi 1/4 to 13 1/2.

Industrials were unchanged at 168.4. Asbestos added 1% to 26 1/2 while Canada Cement was down a point to 57 1/2.

Food and beverage issues were higher with Western adding 1/4 to 18 1/2 and Ogilvie 1/4 to 15 1/2.

The largest transaction Friday involved a food firm. Five thousand Lamontagne Ltd. class A shares were sold for \$20 each, a transaction involving \$100,000.

Machinery issues were up. Massey Ferguson added 1/4 to 33 1/2.

Trade and finance issues were strong with Loeb, Simpsons and Dominion Stores adding 1/4 each to 13 1/2, 28 and 27, respectively.

Senior oils were steady with Pacific Petroleum adding 1/4 to 11 1/2 and Imperial dropping 1/4 to 58 1/2.

Speculative mines were up. Cessland added 10 cents to \$4.00. Jubilee nine cents to \$1.85 and Northern Explorer 8 cents to \$2.07.
