Members of The King's Daughters of Trinity United Church this week re-enacted the founding of the organization by an Interdenominational group of women in New York City in 1886. The presentation was on the stage of Hartz Memorial Hall by a group dressed in the fashion of 70 years ago. The first group formed in Charlottetown was Anglican, presided over by Mrs. Hensley in 1889. Other groups were formed throughout the province and in 1900 the Willing Circle was organized in the Methodist Church, Charlottetown with Mrs. G.M. Young, wife of the Minister, now residing in Fredericton, N.B. as President. The four circles in the province now are all located in the city and are: Silver Cross, Excelsior, Melody and Willing.
