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**Wild geese, ducks, flock to Harvey Moore sanctuary**

Moore's bird sanctuary at Millcove in Kings County is one of more interesting spots for visitors, particularly for those who like to see Canada Geese and wild ducks of various kinds wandering around the loam and swimming lazily in the pond as though they were domestic water fowl.

The sanctuary was founded by the late Harvey Moore who had a natural talent for attracting the wild birds to him. He could call them to him and they would come in great numbers to his arms or his shoulders, or eat grain from his hands as he squatted on the ground. During his lifetime he refused aid of any kind and built up his sanctuary as more and more birds came each year, with the intention of making it a prime tourist attraction, with cabins and other accommodations planned for the future as finances would permit.

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So great was the impact Harvey Moore made on the people of the province the Fish and Game Association moved more than a year ago to build up a trust fund which would finance a Harvey Moore scholarship to worthy student.

The sanctuary is being cared for now by Mrs. Moore and son Brent who feeds the birds with grain supplied by the government.

**CALLIED BIRDS**  
The birds were caught in specially constructed traps for the

purpose. But Harvey Moore never trapped a bird when he was alive. He didn't need any trapping mechanisms for he could call the birds to him at will and band them. A feature of the sanctuary is the upper den which is remote from the highway and the usual visitors. There are number of small islands where the wild birds can nest and hatch their young in comparative safety. Up to 5,000 ducks of many kinds come to the sanctuary each year. They are mallards, baldpates, mallards as well as the more commonly known black ducks.

Many flocks of wild geese touch down at the sanctuary for rest and water during their annual migrations, but they seldom stay long though there are approximately 100 acres that do stay in the area and hatch their young each year.
