## Growers Need Potato Pickers

**SUMMERSIDE** — The local employment office is continuing to have difficulty locating potato pickers in sufficient numbers to fill the demand of farmers in this area, the employment branch supervisor Blanche Hogg, said Wednesday.

Up until 4 p.m. Wednesday there were 343 pickers already registered at the local office with another 32 scheduled to arrive last night. Not counting last night's arrival, she said "we have orders now for over 100."

She was quick to add however, that the demand fluctuates very quickly and that the picture could well change overnight. She mentioned, as an example, the orders received for pickers since Monday and said "we have already received 10 order cancellations since that time."

"If we had 100 pickers available tomorrow I am sure we could place them," she said. "With this bad weather the farmers like to get as many as possible."

"You never can tell," she said, "everything might work out okay," adding that schools close Friday night and that quite a number of students have registered for two weeks' work.

## Christmas Stamp Available Soon

Christmas begins on Oct. 15 at post offices in the province.

For an early start on Christmas mailing, especially for parcels to distant overseas points, the special three and five cent Christmas stamps will be available on Oct. 13.

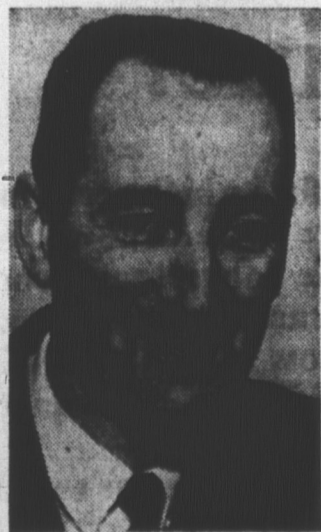
