Souris Dragger Springs Leak, Is Aided To Port

SOURIS — Captain Thomas Heider and his four man crew spent a couple of anxious hours, when their Souris dragger the MV Souris III, sprang a leak while fishing in the Gulf of St. Lawrence about 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

The leak was first discovered by the engineering crew. To add to the discomfort of the crew, when attempts were made to put the bilge pump into operation, it was found to have developed a defect.

At the time the dragger had 15' nets out and these were nearly filled with fish. With the pump broken down, and water rising dangerously close it became necessary to shut down the main engines, and this prevented the nets from being hauled aboard.

A call for assistance was radioed to shore, and this was also picked up by another dragger, the MV Colville Bay and Capt. Percy O'Hanley brought

Fish Landings, Returns To Fishermen Increase

Death Is Said Accidental At Geo'town

GEORGETOWN — A coroner's jury at Georgetown court house Wednesday night found that Sterling Keir Yorston, Georgetown came to his death by accidental drowning on Aug. 23, 1962 at the railway wharf, Georgetown.

The inquest was presided over by Coroner Dr. G. S. A. Imman of Montague.

Five witnesses were heard and the autopsy report of Dr. John Craig, provincial pathologist was read to the jury by the coroner.

Mr. Yorston came to his death when the car in which he was driving plunged over the end of the railway wharf in Georgetown. He was the only occupant of the car and the body when recovered had been in the water approximately 45 minutes.

Witnesses examined at the inquest were: Melvin Yorston, Georgetown; Frederick Myers, Georgetown; Frederick Allen, Georgetown; Const. Lindsay S. Robbins, RCMP, Montague; and Douglas Coffin, Montague.

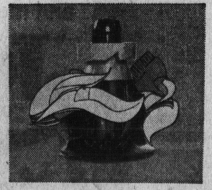
