

From One Cook to Another



ONCE IN A LONG, LONG TIME, a really new and wonderful dessert comes your way. I'm happy to have my share in telling folks about the latest such dessert — **Frosted Fondant Pudding**. FROSTED FONDANT Pudding

1 package Jell-O Vanilla Pudding
1 package Jell-O Chocolate Pudding
1 cup Carnation Evaporated Milk
1 cup water

Prepare Jell-O Vanilla Pudding according to package directions, but using 1 1/2 cups Carnation Evaporated Milk instead of the milk. Do the same with the Chocolate Pudding. Cool, but do not chill. "Frost" the edges of dessert glasses. Put the puddings by spoonfuls in the glasses, alternating flavors. With a small knife, cut through puddings in a zigzag course, to "marble". Chill. Serves 8.

To "Frost" Dessert Glasses: Dip firm of glasses in slightly-beaten egg white, then in fruit sugar. Let stand until set.

(4 servings)
1 tablespoon butter

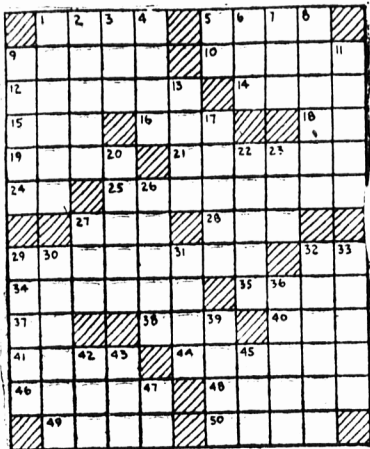
Chill undiluted Carnation in freezing tray of refrigerator until small crystals form around edges. Or chill unopened can several hours on ice. Chill bowl and beater. Whip rapidly. For each 1/2 cup Carnation used, add 1 tbsp. lemon juice after whipping to the foamy stage. Whip stiff — sweeten to taste. (For recipe that calls for whipped cream folded in, omit lemon juice and sugar.)
