Litton alternatives — U.P.E.I. Group

The U.P.E.I. People for Peaceful Alternatives was formed on February 13. On short notice, about 12 concerned people came together to deal with the perceived effect of the Business Students Society's plan to have Ron Keating (President of Litton Systems) as guest speaker at their annual fund-raising dinner. The U.P.E.I. People for Peaceful Alternatives (U.P.P.A.) has no intention of interfering with the business students' plans. Rather our concern is that the Island population might view their action as an official position. This issue

was dealt with, and proposals were made in an effort to forestall such a conclusion.

As President Elliot explained to various media people, there are different points of view within the University community regarding Litton's proposed location on the Island. Public expression of these different views has already been made.

U.P.P.A. has met several times since February 13 and is proceeding with plans to co-sponsor a March 4 event with the Island Way, as reported elsewhere in this

issue. Plans for other activities are being considered.

Membership in U.P.P.A. cuts across all sectors of the University community. The Group's position is that Litton Systems is not an appropriate business for P.E.I. and should not be granted a contract to located a plant on the Island. Any other persons who are interested in working on alternatives to Litton's establishment on the Island will be welcomed into the Group.
