ESTEEMED EXCHANGES.

Mail and Empire: Mr. Fisher, the prohibition Minister, who is touring in England with the rest of them, has just declared in a London interview that "our making of wine is as yet only in the experimental stage, but we hope to make something of it."

Montreal Gazette: It is said that President McKinley favors a colonial form of government for the territory acquired from Spain, and that the Canadian Constitution will probably be copied for the benefit of Porto Rico. This is, of course, very complimentary to Canada, but the Americans would do well to note that Great Britain has given a fuller share of liberty to the Dominion than to any other portion of the British Empire. Colonies much further advanced than Porto Rico are kept within the control of the Colonial Office, exercised through the governor of the colony. An enquiry into the system of government adopted in the British Crown colonies would probably be to the President's advantage.

Big Fires in Europe.

LONDON, Aug. 19.—From various points on the Continent, in addition to Nijni-Novgorod, Russia reports have been received of serious conflagrations. Extensive forest fires are raging in the mountains near Ferrol, Spain. At Achenbeck, not far from Brussels, the Sainte Marie market place, a large building, and seven houses adjoining, were burned, with an estimated loss of \$50,000.
