Prudham Rejects Proposal For National Fuel Policy

OTTAWA (CP) — Mines Minister Prudham Friday outlined some improvements in Canada's economically-troubled coal industry and rejected opposition proposals for a national fuel policy. He said that coal production, which has slipped in recent years, increased by 314,000 tons to 15,014,000 tons in the recently ended fiscal year.
