SUMMERSIDE — Negotiations are commencing to bring in Dave Downey and Jim Mueller in the feature bout of a forthcoming R and H card tentatively scheduled later this month or early October.

The supporting bouts would consist of local talent and Summerside and Charlottetown pugilists are said to be earnestly preparing for the proposed card.

One of the ring favorites in the last night of fighting, and first in a decade on the Island, was Hook Walsh and an R and H Enterprises official said Friday that Walsh is "signed, sealed, and delivered" for the proposed card.

The headliners put a good showing in their matches in the fortnight ago. Dave Downey of Halifax says that he is ready to tackle Jim Mueller of Toronto and New York, who is the No. 1 challenger to Blair Richardson's "Middleweight" title.

Promoters of the bout stress that they are still working on it and so far, nothing definite has been settled.
