Louise Jobin of Quebec City captured the last closed singles championship. She scored a well-earned 2-6, 6-1, 6-4 victory over Jerry Borland of Winnipeg who won the closed juvenile girl's singles Monday.

Miss Jobin reached the final when her opponent in the semifinals, Ruth Nunn of Toronto, fainted and couldn't continue.

The top-seeded entries in the open junior men's singles, Smith Chapman of Montreal and David Breckner of Baltimore, reached the quarter-finals with little trouble.

The second-seeded Canadian and foreign entries, Francois Godbout of Quebec City and Tony Lieberman of Philadelphia, had no trouble either in reaching quarter finals.

Walters is only 31 years old but has performed as a stuntman for 17 of those years and has appeared in motion pictures, T.V., and all over North America.

Marie In 5th Round TKO Over Champion Howard

HALIFAX (CP)—A tough counter-punching Basil Marie of Philadelphia won a fifth-round technical knockout over Canadian lightweight champion Dick Howard of Halifax here Tuesday night.

Dr. Saul Keshen, Halifax athletic commission physician, stopped the bout after examining Howard's badly cut eye. The wound bled so profusely that Marie, referee Jack Delaney and Howard were spattered with blood.

The fight had been billed for 10 rounds. Marie weighed 140, Howard 136.

The American's sharp punches opened the cut midway through the third round and Howard's handlers couldn't cope with the flow of blood. Dr. Keshen permitted the bout to continue after a third-round examination but stopped it when he took a second look.

Howard otherwise appeared in little trouble. He was hitting hard and it was apparent he was trying for a knockout before the cut put an end to his chances.

In a six-round semi-final, Le Roy Rocco Jones of Halifax won a split decision over Jerry Simpson of Montreal on a punching spurge in the last two rounds.

The other bouts saw heavyweights Bob Gray, 180, of Stratford, Ont., and Cecil Gray, 191 1/2, of Halifax battle to a six-round draw and Benny Randall, 123 1/2, of Sydney decision Doug Gibson, 126, of Kentville in four rounds.

N. S. Football League Meeting

HALIFAX (CP)—The Nova Scotia Canadian Football League says it will apply for membership to the Canadian Rugby Union next year.

The league, completing an executive meeting early Tuesday, said it would enter the junior and intermediate Dominion finals when its membership in the CRU was approved.

Televising of this year's games in the Halifax area was approved by the executive, and the portion of the gate receipts paid to field owners will be reduced to 20 per cent from 33 1/3 per cent.

Willing To Put Crown On Line

BOLOGNA, Italy (AP)—The sports paper Stadio said heavy-weight champion Rocky Marciano's manager Al Weir is willing to put the crown on the line in Bologna against European champion Francesco Cavichi—if the price is right.

Stadio correspondent Lino Manchia, who now is in Grossingoro, N.Y., said he had been requested by Weir to reach Italian promoter Renzo Longo.

Cavichi decided Germany's Heinz Neuhaus for the European crown before 60,000 persons here in June. Torri promoted the bout.

Roach MacGregor drove Andrew Perry's great bay gelding Bay State Pat to straight heat wins in the feature race, the free-for-all pace, at the Driving Park last night before the largest crowd of the season.

Bay State Pat won the first two heats after terrific stretch drives that brought him from dead last both times to the lead at the wire. He finished second in the third heat behind Josedale Clansman but after a 40 minute deliberation by the judges Josedale Clansman was set back to eighth place because he interfered with Josedale Double Hal and Skelter on the first turn and according to the rules had to be placed behind the horses he interfered with.

Bay State Pat's time of 2:07 3/5 in the second heat of the Free-For-All was the fastest recorded at the Driving Park this season.

Ann's Dream took second spot in the first and third dashes and third in the second while Josedale Clansman placed second in the second dash and Richard was third in the first and last heats.

In the first heat of the C Pace, Wait For Me and Hoosier Doctor tangled on the first turn and one of the two went down. It was feared for a time that the horse might have been hurt but he was able to walk off the track under his own power and return for the second and third dashes.

Eva York topped the first two dashes of the C Pace and Humdale the third.

The three dashes of the C Trot were evenly divided between Tommy Shanter, Farmer Brown and Nightmare Alice, who gave the biggest pay of the evening—\$31.60 to win the third heat.

Other good pays were Nightmare Alice to place and show, \$13.80 and \$10.70; Farmer Brown \$10.70 to win; Humdale \$13.20 to win; Ann's Dream \$16.30 to place; Eva York \$12.70 to win and Miss Commando \$15.00 to place.

Two horses set new marks for themselves. Farmer Brown clipped 6 2/3 seconds from his old mark of 2:23 1/2 and Nightmare Alice brought her record down to 2:21.
