**WINTER VENTILATION**  
With proper ventilation you can keep litter dry, birds comfortable, and never have a water freezing problem with outside temperatures as low as 30 below and birds crowded in at 2 sq. ft. per bird! This illustrates what proper ventilation can do, (at least when teamed up with good insulation).

Most poultrymen know: warm air rises, cold air falls; warm air carries much, much more moisture than cold air. But they don't act as if they know it. In winter, they let cold air enter by windows and spill to the floor. Body heat from the birds rises and escapes via eaves or ventilators without being conserved to keep pen comfort-
