Quick action and courage on the part of a young Summerside lad probably saved the life of his playmate and cousin on Friday evening just after the supper hour.

Robert Holman, son of Mr. and Mrs. H.T. Holman, Jr. and Alan Holman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alan Holman were playing by themselves on Holman's Wharf when suddenly Alan fell overboard.

The water at this point would be well over the boy's head. Without stopping to divest himself of his shoes or heavy jacket, Robert jumped in after him. Robert is a competent swimmer while Alan can swim only a little.

Together they grasped a part of the wharf and held themselves afloat and then commenced to work their way to a point along the wharf where they could pull themselves up, which they succeeded in doing.

Robert was even able to save his cap which had fallen off and was floating away on the water. No one saw the incident and there was no body around to help them. If the water had been rough or they had been unable to grab back on the wharf there might easily have been a tragic ending to the story. Both boys are about ten years of age.-S
